RESOLUTION ADOPTING THE REVISED CONFLICT OF INTEREST CODE FOR THE CENTRE CITY DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION.

WHEREAS, by Resolution No. R-294177, adopted on November 20, 2000, the City Council approved the Center City Development Corporation's Conflict of Interest Code, which was revised and updated following the required City-wide biennial review of all conflict of interest codes for which the City Council serves as code reviewing body; and

WHEREAS, Government Code section 87306.5 requires biennial review of local agency conflict of interest codes every even-numbered year; and

WHEREAS, Government Code section 87306 requires agencies to amend their conflict of interest codes whenever an amendment is necessitated by changed circumstances, including the creation of new positions which must be designated and relevant changes in the duties assigned to existing positions; and

WHEREAS, the Centre City Development Corporation has proposed changes to

Appendix A of that office's conflict of interest code to accurately reflect designated positions and

appropriate disclosure categories; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED that the Centre City Development Corporation's proposed changes to Appendix A of that office's conflict of interest code are hereby approved and are incorporated into its conflict of interest code.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that revised Appendix A to the Centre City Development Corporation's Conflict of Interest Code be placed on file in the Office of the City Clerk as Document No. RR-297303.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the revised Conflict of Interest Code for the Centre City Development Corporation becomes effective upon the date of adoption of this resolution.

The President may determine in writing that a particular consultant, although a "designated employee," is hired to perform a range of duties that is limited in scope and is thus not required to fully comply with the disclosure requirements described in this Appendix. Such written determination shall include a description of the consultant's duties, and based upon that description, a statement of the extent of disclosure requirements. The President's determination is a public record and shall be retained for public inspection in the same manner and location as this Conflict of Interest Code.

Consultants on retainer who: (i) serve in a staff (or extension of staff) capacity; and/or (ii) provide services to the Corporation on an ongoing basis, are included in the list of designated employees and shall disclose pursuant to the scope of disclosure determined at the time of formation of the contract, subject to the following limitations:

The Corporation has determined that the following consultants are not subject to its Conflict of Interest Code and shall not be required to file economic disclosure forms:

- (1) Consultants who volunteer services to the Corporation;
- (2) Consultants who provide limited duties for specific litigation or special projects;
- (3) Expert witnesses; and
- (4) Consultants who provide expertise in limited areas for specific litigation or special projects.

CONFLICT OF INTEREST CODE OF

CENTRE CITY DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION

as amended 7/31, 2002

1. Standard Code of FPPC

The Political Reform Act, located at Government Code Sections 81000, et seq. ("the Act") requires each state and local government agency to adopt and promulgate a conflict of interest code. Centre City Development Corporation ("the Corporation") has heretofore adopted such a code. The Fair Political Practices Commission ("the FPPC") has promulgated a regulation (2 California Code of Regulations Section 18730) that contains the terms of a standard conflict of interest code and can be incorporated by reference as an agency's code. After public notice and hearing the regulation may be amended by the FPPC to conform to the requirements in the Act.

2. Adoption of Standard Code of FPPC

The terms of Title 2, California Code of Regulations Section 18730, and future amendments thereto as may be duly adopted from time to time by the FPPC, are hereby incorporated by reference. This Regulation and Appendix A, attached hereto and incorporated by reference, designating officials and employees and establishing disclosure categories, shall constitute the Conflict of Interest Code of the Corporation ("Code"). This Code shall take effect when approved by the City of San Diego, and shall thereupon supersede and replace all prior conflict of interest codes adopted the Corporation.

3. Filing of Statements of Economic Interests

Pursuant to Section 4 of the standard FPPC conflict of interest code, designated officials and employees set forth in Column I of Appendix A, attached hereto and incorporated by reference, shall file statements of economic interests, with the Secretary of the Corporation, disclosing interests, investments or positions in, and gifts and/or income derived from, the types of business or real estate set forth in the disclosure categories listed in Column II of Appendix A. Upon receipt of the statements, the Secretary shall make and retain copies and forward the originals of these statements to the City of San Diego.
