A RESOLUTION DECLARING THE RESULTS OF THE GENERAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION AND THE SPECIAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION HELD IN THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO ON NOVEMBER 5, 2002.

WHEREAS, a general municipal election was held in the City of San Diego on Tuesday, November 5, 2002, pursuant to the provisions of Ordinance No. O-19081 (New Series), adopted July 22, 2002, for the purpose of electing a candidate to the office of Councilmember in Districts 2 and 4; and

WHEREAS, a special municipal election was held in the City of San Diego on the same date, pursuant to the provisions of Ordinance No. O-19082 (New Series), adopted July 22, 2002, which special election was consolidated with the state general election for the purpose of submitting to the qualified voters of the City of San Diego one or more ballot propositions; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to one (1) separate ordinance, one (1) proposition was placed upon the November 5, 2002 ballot, which proposition is described as follows:

(1) one proposition relating to "affordable housing for the City of San Diego," as defined in Article 34 of the California Constitution, was placed on the ballot by Ordinance No. O-19002 (New Series), adopted July 22, 2002 (Proposition "A"); and

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of the City of San Diego, that the Council finds and determines, pursuant to the provisions of Section 27.0411 of the San Diego Municipal Code, as follows:

The whole number of votes cast in the City was 256,957.


