

ORDINANCE NUMBER O-19028 (NEW SERIES)

ADOPTED ON JANUARY 28, 2002

AN ORDINANCE OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF
SAN DIEGO AMENDING CHAPTER 2, ARTICLE 6, OF
THE SAN DIEGO MUNICIPAL CODE BY AMENDING
SECTION 26.06 RELATING TO SMALL BUSINESS
ADVISORY BOARD.

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. That Chapter 2, Article 6, of the San Diego Municipal Code is hereby amended
by amending section 26.06, to read as follows:

§26.06 Small Business Advisory Board

- (a) [No change in text.]
- (b) Small Business Advisory Board Established. There is hereby established a Small Business Advisory Board consisting of eleven (11) members who shall serve without compensation. The Board shall include one (1) representative from each of the following groups:
 - (1) Small Business Administration District Director or designated representative;
 - (2) President of the Business Improvement District Council or designated representative.

The nine remaining appointees considered for selection may include, but not limited to, representatives of the following areas of interest and expertise:

- (A) Small business owner;
- (B) Accounting, financial-lending, legal or economic backgrounds;
- (C) Advocates of small business interests with governmental agencies;

The members shall serve two (2) year terms and each member shall serve until a successor is duly appointed and confirmed. The members shall be appointed by the Mayor and confirmed by the Council. The members shall be appointed in such manner so that the terms of not more than five (5) members shall expire in any year. The expiration date of all terms shall be July 1. The Board shall select from among its members a Chairperson. The Board shall meet not less than once every three (3) months and present a report to the Mayor and Council on an annual basis. The Mayor shall appoint one member of the Council to serve as liaison to the Board and one other member of the Council as an alternate.

When filling a future Board vacancy, the City Council shall seek recommendations from the sitting members of the Board regarding

the background needed by candidates for the appointment in order to provide a breadth of representation reflective of the small business community in the City.

The Board shall adopt rules consistent with laws for the government of its business and procedures.

(c) [No change in text.]

Section 2. That a full reading of this ordinance is dispensed with prior to its final passage, a written or printed copy having been available to the City Council and the public a day prior to its final passage.

Section 3. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force on the thirtieth day from and after its passage.
