WHEREAS, after 22 years of dedicated service to the museum and to the San Diego community, Dr. Sharon will be accepting a post as director of the Phoebe Hearst Museum of Anthropology at UC Berkeley and will be honored at a farewell gathering at the Museum of Man on December 10, 2002; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of the City of San Diego, that this Council does hereby honor Dr. Douglas Sharon for his longstanding commitment to the City of San Diego,

Balboa Park and the Museum of Man, and congratulates him on his new post.
