

RESOLUTION NUMBER R- 297628

ADOPTED ON FEB 10 2003

WHEREAS, Proposition 50 provides \$3.44 billion for various water purposes; and

WHEREAS, these funds are to be distributed in one of three ways: (1) Legislative Earmarks (Bills passed by the Legislature and signed by the Governor.), (2) Competitive Grants (Awards made by agencies of state government.), and (3) Bond Earmarks (Projects listed in the ballot proposition.); and

WHEREAS, the Governor proposes \$1.1 billion in Proposition 50 spending in his 2003 – 2004 budget proposal; and

WHEREAS, San Diego plans to seek funding for three purposes: (1) Drinking Water, (2) Storm Water Pollution Prevention, and (3) Multiple Species Conservation Program [MSCP]; and

WHEREAS, The Governmental Relations, Water, General Services, and Planning Departments recommend adoption of the following project priority lists:

1. Projects consistent with the Long Range Water Resources Plan, adopted by Council on December 9, 2002, and the Council approved Rate Case supporting the Capital Improvement Program on April 30, 2002. Projects are listed in priority order (Attachment A);
2. Storm Water Pollution Prevention projects in priority order, recommended by the General Services Department and adopted by the Council on June 4, 2002 (Attachment A); and

3. List of MSCP projects in priority order, recommended by the Planning Department and adopted by the Council on June 4, 2002 (Attachment A);

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of the City of San Diego, that the proposed project lists for all Proposition 50 programming during Calendar Year 2003 are adopted as set forth in the Memorandum of the Governmental Relations Department dated February 5, 2003, a copy of which is on file in the Office of the City Clerk as Document No. RR- 297628.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Governmental Relations Department is directed to communicate these priorities to the Governor and members of the State Legislature and to negotiate for the inclusion of these projects in any authorizing legislation.
