

RESOLUTION NUMBER R- 298094

ADOPTED ON JUN 17 2003

WHEREAS, the U.S. Government, through the State of California Department of Parks and Recreation, has funds available to develop facilities for public outdoor recreation purposes, known as the Federal Land and Water Conservation Fund [LWCF]; and

WHEREAS, in the City of San Diego there is an abandoned freeway corridor in the Southcrest Community known as the State Route 252 Corridor Park; and

WHEREAS, the City of San Diego desires to develop the State Route 252 Corridor Park into a passive park, with an open turf field, amenities for picnicking, security lighting, landscaping and walkways; and

WHEREAS, on April 11, 2000, the Redevelopment Agency of the City of San Diego by Resolution No. R-03141, agreed to transfer \$500,000 to the City to facilitate improvement to this park; and

WHEREAS, on April 11, 2000, the Council, by passage of Resolution No. R-292980 accepted the \$500,000; NOW THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of the City of San Diego that the City Manager is authorized to:

1. apply to the State of California Land and Water Conservation Fund Program for funds for the development of the State Route 252 Corridor Park;

2. conduct all negotiations, execute and submit all documents including but not limited to applications, agreements, and payments requests, which may be necessary; and
3. to accept, appropriate and expend funds received.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that an increase of \$276,550 in the FY03 Capital Improvement Program Budget in CIP No. 29-458.0, State Route 252 Corridor Park, upon receipt of a fully executed grant agreement is authorized.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City Auditor and Comptroller is authorized to:

1. establish a special interest-bearing fund for the monies allocated for the State Route 252 Corridor Park; and
2. appropriate and expend \$776,550 from CIP No. 29-458.0, State Route 252 Corridor Development, upon receipt of a fully executed grant agreement.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Council of the City of San Diego certifies that it has reviewed and understands the General Provisions contained in the Project Contract shown in the Procedural Guide, and that it has or will have the sufficient funds to operate and maintain the grant funded project.
