

RESOLUTION NUMBER R- 298622

ADOPTED ON NOV 24 2003

WHEREAS, the San Diego City Attorney's Office implemented the Mid-City Community Court in February 2003 to enhance quality of life and improve public access to the justice system in the Mid-City area of San Diego by holding eligible misdemeanor offenders accountable to the community through community work service and refer offenders to educational, preventative, and rehabilitative programs designed to curb future criminal conduct; and

WHEREAS, the Prostitution Impact Panel educates offenders about the far-reaching, detrimental effects of prostitution on San Diego's communities; and

WHEREAS, by Resolution adopted on April 1, 2003, the San Diego City Council authorized and directed the City Auditor and Comptroller to establish the Mid-City Neighborhood Prosecution Initiatives Fund for the purpose of funding the operation of the Mid-City Community Court and Prostitution Impact Panel programs; and

WHEREAS, by Resolution adopted on April 1, 2003, the San Diego City Council authorized that any monies deposited into the Mid-City Neighborhood Prosecution Initiatives Fund, including grants or funding received for the specific purpose of enhancing the programs, were appropriated and authorized to be expended from time to time for the purpose of the Fund; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of the City of San Diego, that the City Attorney is hereby authorized to apply for, accept, and expend a \$50,000 grant from the San Diego Revitalization Corporation to fund enhanced services at the Mid-City Community Court, under the terms and conditions set forth in the letter dated March 4, 2003 to the City Attorney's Office from James F. Cahill of the San Diego Revitalization Corporation, a copy of which is on file with the City Clerk's Office as Document No. RR- 298622.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the \$50,000 grant award shall be placed in the Mid-City Neighborhood Prosecution Initiatives Fund, appropriated, and expended for the purpose of funding enhanced services at the Mid-City Community Court, including expansion of the community work service component of the Court.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City of San Diego hereby agrees to indemnify, defend, and hold harmless the San Diego Revitalization Corporation and its agents and employees from any liability arising out of the Corporation's funding of the grant project.
