A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF
SAN DIEGO DECLARING A CONTINUED STATE OF
EMERGENCY DUE TO ECONOMIC CIRCUMSTANCES
IN THE SAN DIEGO-TIJUANA BORDER REGION

WHEREAS, California Government Code section 8630 authorizes local governing bodies to proclaim local emergencies when such events occur as are defined by California Government Code section 8558(c); and


WHEREAS, on December 10, 2001, the City Council adopted Resolution No. R-295866 declaring the existence of a state of emergency in that area of the City of San Diego immediately adjacent to the United States-Mexico border due to the economic circumstances in the San Diego-Tijuana border area; and

WHEREAS, the Council finds that such emergency continues to exist in that area of the City of San Diego immediately adjacent to the United States-Mexico border; NOW,
THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of the City of San Diego, that pursuant to California Government Code section 8630, a continued state of emergency is declared to exist in that area of the City of San Diego immediately adjacent to the United States-Mexico border, due to the economic circumstances in the San Diego-Tijuana border area.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the measures previously taken by the City Council
in Resolution No. R-295866 shall continue to have full force and effect.
