A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO TERMINATING THE STATE OF EMERGENCY IN CONNECTION WITH THE ECONOMIC CIRCUMSTANCES AT THE SAN DIEGO-TIJUANA BORDER.

WHEREAS, Government Code section 8630 authorizes local governing bodies to proclaim local emergencies and to proclaim the termination of local emergencies at the earliest possible date warranted; and

WHEREAS, on December 10, 2001, the Council of The City of San Diego [Council] adopted Resolution No. R-295866 declaring the existence of a state of emergency in the San Diego-Tijuana border area due to the after effects of the terrorist attack on September 11, 2001, and the resulting economic impact of increased border security including increased wait times at the border and decreased cross-border traffic and commerce; and

WHEREAS, since the initial declaration of the state of emergency on December 10, 2001, every two weeks through March 14, 2005, the Council has declared a continued state of emergency in connection therewith; and

WHEREAS, the emergency due to the economic circumstances in the San Diego-Tijuana border area no longer exists; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of the City of San Diego, that, pursuant to Government Code Section 8630, the state of emergency relative to the economic circumstances in the San Diego-Tijuana border area is hereby proclaimed terminated.
