WHEREAS, the City of San Diego has, from time to time, considered waiving the protections of the Attorney-Client Privilege and the Work Product Doctrine; and

WHEREAS, the City has already waived the protections of the Attorney-Client Privilege and the Work Product Doctrine for documents responsive to the Securities and Exchange Commission's initial document requests and the U. S. Attorney's subpoenas through February 12, 2004; and


WHEREAS, most recently, the City waived the protections of the Attorney-Client Privilege and the Work Product Doctrine for documents responsive to the needs of the U. S. Attorney's subpoena regarding the so called "file cleaning day" at the City; and

WHEREAS, the City has been asked by the San Diego County District Attorney to provide for purposes of an investigation by that Office a report prepared for the City by the law firm Luce, Forward, Hamilton & Scripps relating to certain pension benefits, NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of the City of San Diego, on behalf of the City of San Diego, that the protections of the Attorney-Client Privilege and the Work Product Doctrine are waived as to the report prepared for the City by the law firm Luce, Forward, Hamilton &

Scripps relating to certain pension benefits for the purpose of providing such documents to the San Diego County District Attorney.
