EXHIBIT A MITIGATION MONITORING AND REPORTING PROGRAM TORREY DEL MAR NEIGHBORHOOD PARK

This Mitigation Monitoring and Reporting Program is designed to ensure compliance with Public Resources Code Section 21081.6 during implementation of mitigation measures. This program identifies at a minimum: the department responsible for the monitoring, what is to be monitored, how the monitoring shall be accomplished, the monitoring and reporting schedule, and completion requirements. A record of the Mitigation Monitoring and Reporting Program will be maintained at the offices of the Land Development Review Division, 1222 First Avenue, Fifth Floor, San Diego, CA 92101. All mitigation measures contained in the Mitigated Negative Declaration (Project No.54402) shall be made conditions as may be further described below.

GENERAL

- 1. Prior to the preconstruction meeting, the Assistant Deputy Director [ADD] of the Land Development Review Division [LDR] shall verify the following mitigation measures are noted on a separate sheet of the construction/grading plans submitted and included in the specifications under the heading Environmental Mitigation Requirements.
- 2. The owner/permittee shall make arrangement to schedule a preconstruction meeting to ensure implementation of the Mitigation, Monitoring and Reporting Program [MMRP]. The meeting shall include the City's Mitigation Monitoring Coordination Section [MMC]. If construction is to occur during the breeding season of the California Gnatcatcher, the project biologist shall also attend the meeting.

BIOLOGICAL RESOURCES

COASTAL CALIFORNIA GNATCATCHER (Federally Threatened)

1. Prior to the preconstruction meeting, the City Manager (or appointed designee) shall verify that the Multi-Habitat Planning Area [MHPA] boundaries and the following project requirements regarding the coastal California gnatcatcher are shown on the construction plans:

NO clearing, grubbing, grading, or other construction activities shall occur between March 1 and August 15, the breeding season of the Coastal California Gnatcatcher, until the following requirements have been met to the satisfaction of the City Manager:

A. Prior to the bid award, the applicant shall submit a letter of verification to MMC identifying the qualified biologist for the project. A qualified biologist (possessing a valid endangered species act section 10(a)(1)(A)

recovery permit) shall survey those habitat areas WITHIN THE MHPA that would be subject to construction noise levels exceeding 60 decibels [dB(A)] hourly average for the presence of the Coast California Gnatcatcher. Surveys for the Coast Coastal California Gnatcatcher shall be conducted pursuant to the protocol survey guidelines established by the U.S Fish and Wildlife Service within the breeding season prior to the commencement of any construction. If Gnatcatchers are present, then the following conditions must be met:

- I. Between March 1 and August 15, no clearing, grubbing, or grading of occupied Gnatcatcher habitat shall be permitted. Areas restricted from such activities shall be staked or fenced under the supervision of a qualified biologist; AND
- II. Between March 1 and August 15, no construction activities hall occur within any portion of the site where construction activities would result in noise levels exceeding 60 dB(A) hourly average at the edge of occupied Gnatcatcher habitat. An analysis showing that noise generated by the construction activities would not exceed 60 dB(A) hourly average at the edge of occupied habitat must be completed by a qualified Acoustician (possessing current noise engineer license or registration with monitoring noise experience with listed animal species) and approved by the city manager at least two weeks prior to the commencement of construction activities. Prior to the commencement of construction activities during the breeding season, areas restricted from such activities shall be staked or fenced under supervision of a qualified biologist; OR
- III. At least two weeks prior to the commencement of construction activities, under the direction of a qualified acoustician, noise attenuation measures (e.g., berms, walls) shall be implemented to ensure that noise levels resulting from construction activities will not exceed 60 dB(A) hourly average at the edge of habitat occupied by the Coastal California Gnatcatcher. Concurrent with the commencement of construction activities and the construction of necessary noise attenuation facilities, noise monitoring* shall be conducted at the edge of the occupied habitat area to ensure that noise levels do not exceed 60 dB(A) hourly average. If the noise attenuation techniques implemented are determined to be inadequate by the qualified acoustician or biologist, then the associated construction activities shall cease until such time that adequate attenuation is achieved or until the end of the breeding season (August 16).

- * Construction noise monitoring shall continue to be monitored at least twice weekly on varying days, or more frequently depending on the construction activity, to verify that noise levels at the edge of occupied habitat are maintained below 60 dB(A) hourly average or to the ambient noise level if it already exceeds 60 dB(A) hourly average. If not, other measures shall be implemented in consultation with the biologist and the City Manager, as necessary, to reduce noise levels to below 60 dB(A) hourly average or to the ambient noise level if it already exceeds 60 dB(A) hourly average. Such measures may include, but are not limited to, limitations on the placement of construction equipment and the simultaneous use of equipment.
- B. If Coastal California Gnatcatcher are detected ruing the protocol survey, the qualified biologist shall submit substantial evidence to the City Manager and applicable resource agencies which demonstrates whether or not mitigation measures such as noise walls are necessary between March 1 and August 15 as follows:
 - I. If this evidence indicates the potential is high for Coastal California Gnatcatcher to be present based on historical records or site conditions, then condition A. III shall be adhered to as specified above.
 - II. If this evidence concludes that no impacts to this species are anticipated, no mitigation measures would be necessary.

MMC shall notify the RE of receipt of the Final Biological Monitoring Report.

The above mitigation monitoring and reporting program will require additional fees and/or deposits to be collected prior to the issuance of building permits, certificates of occupancy and/or final maps to ensure the successful completion of the monitoring program.
