RESOLUTION ADOPTING A CONFLICT OF INTEREST CODE FOR COMMUNITY SERVICES

DATE OF FINAL PASSAGE

WHEREAS, Government Code sections 87300 and 87302 require local agencies to adopt conflict of interest codes designating positions that involve the making or participation in making of decisions which may foreseeably have a material effect on financial interests, and for each position, the financial interests which are reportable; and

WHEREAS, Community Services previously was a division of the Community and Economic Development Department, which last enacted a conflict of interest code by Resolution R-299948 on December 7, 2004; and

WHEREAS, in compliance with Government Code section 87306.5, the City is in the midst of a City-wide biennial review of all conflict of interest codes for which the City Council serves as code reviewing body; and

WHEREAS, Community Services became a stand alone division in fiscal year 2007 and is part of Neighborhood and Customer Services along with five other divisions, each with its own conflicts of interest code; and

WHEREAS, Community Services now seeks to enact its first stand alone conflict of interest code, which includes new positions that had not been previously designated, eliminates positions no longer needed as a result of restructuring and updates required filing categories for each position; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Attorney recommend that a Conflict of Interest Code be adopted for Community Services; and

WHEREAS, the City Council concurs in this recommendation; NOW THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of the City of San Diego, that a Conflict of Interest Code for Community Services is hereby adopted, consisting of standard language embodied in title 2, section 18730 of the California Code of Regulations, and any amendments to that regulation duly adopted by the Fair Political Practices Commission, with Appendix A showing designated positions and their duties, and Appendix B showing the disclosure categories.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a copy of Appendix A and Appendix B to the Conflict of Interest Code for Community Services as adopted be placed on file in the Office of the City Clerk as Document No. RR-302224

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the persons whose positions are designated in the new Conflict of Interest Code for Community Services shall file their statements of economic interest with the City Clerk.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the statements of economic interest filed by designated persons be retained by the Office of the City Clerk and be made available for public inspection and reproduction.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Conflict of Interest Code for Community Services becomes effective upon the date of final passage of this resolution.

Supervise professional staff responsible for City implementation of Title II of Americans with Disabilities Act and relevant legislation compliance; update and implement the City's Transition Plan and respond to and track associated complaints and issues.	2

APPENDIX B DISCLOSURE CATEGORIES

CATEGORY 1:

- a. Investments and business positions in any business entity located in or doing business with the City of San Diego.
- b. Income and gifts from sources located in or doing business with the City of San Diego.
- c. Interest in real property located in the City of San Diego, including property located within a two-mile radius of any property owned or used by the City.

CATEGORY 2:

- a. Investments and business positions in any firm or business entity that supplies goods or services to the City, that is a tenant of the City, that is an adverse party to the City in a legal proceeding, or is granted authority by the City to use City facilities.
- b. Income and gifts from any person or business entity that supplies goods or services to the City, who is a tenant of the City, who is an adverse party to the City in a legal proceeding, or who is granted authority by the City to use City facilities.
- c. Interest in real property located in the City of San Diego, including property located within a two-mile radius of any property owned or used by the City.

CATEGORY 3:

Consultants shall be included in the list of designated employees and shall disclose pursuant to the broadest disclosure category in the code subject to the following limitations:

The Mayor, the Community Services Deputy Director or designee may determine in writing that a particular consultant although a "designated position," is hired to perform a range of duties that is limited in scope and thus is not required to fully comply with the disclosure requirements in this section. Such written determination shall include a description of the consultant's duties and based upon that description, a statement of the extent of disclosure requirements. That determination is a public record and shall be retained for public inspection in the same manner and location as this conflict of interest code.
