WHEREAS, in 1983 Phil graduated from San Jose State University with a Bachelors Degree in Journalism; and

WHEREAS, after working at The Las Vegas Review-Journal, he came to work for The San Diego Union-Tribune in 1990 as a federal courts reporter working on several high-profile criminal and civil trials and breaking a story of how abuses of the informant system led to a near-fatal raid on an innocent businessman's home by federal agents, which was picked up and aired by "60 Minutes;" and

WHEREAS, Phil then moved on to work at The San Diego Union-Tribune as the City Hall reporter covering Mayor Susan Golding's administration, the 1996 Republican National Convention and the 1996 mayor's race; and

WHEREAS, in 1997 he became the Union-Tribune's public finance writer covering the controversial Qualcomm Stadium expansion, the politics and financing of the new ballpark for the Padres, broke the story of a conflict of interest between a San Diego City Councilmember and the Padres organization, resulting in that councilmember resigning from office and receiving a criminal conviction; and

WHEREAS, Phil spent his final six years with the Union-Tribune as a politics writer covering mayoral contests, the 2003 gubernatorial recall, legislative campaigns, the city's pension crisis and the resulting SEC investigations and sanctions; and
