## RESOLUTION NUMBER R-304517 ADOPTED ON DEC 0 2 2008

A RESOLUTION DECLARING THE RESULTS OF THE MUNICIPAL GENERAL ELECTION AND THE MUNICIPAL SPECIAL ELECTION HELD IN THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO ON NOVEMBER 4, 2008.

WHEREAS, a municipal general election was held in the City of San Diego on Tuesday, November 4, 2008, pursuant to the provisions of Ordinance No. O-19771 (New Series), adopted July 15, 2008, for the purpose of electing a candidate to the office of City Attorney, and the offices of Councilmember in Districts One (1), Three (3), and Seven (7); and

WHEREAS, a municipal special election was held in the City of San Diego on Tuesday, November 4, 2008, pursuant to the provisions of Ordinance No. 19770 (New Series), adopted July 15, 2008, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified voters of the City of San Diego two ballot propositions, described as follows:

- (1) One proposition amending the City Charter for the City of San Diego [Charter] by adding Section 55.2 was placed on the ballot by Ordinance No. O-19776, adopted on July 28, 2008 (Proposition C); and
- (2) One proposition amending Chapter 5, Article 6, Division 0 of the San Diego Municipal Code, by amending Section 56.54, was placed on the ballot by Ordinance No. O-19779, adopted on July 29, 2008 (Proposition D); and WHEREAS, these propositions read as follows:

PROPOSITION C. AMENDS THE CHARTER OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO DESIGNATING THE USE OF THE LEASE REVENUE FROM MISSION BAY PARK. Shall the City Charter be amended requiring the annual lease revenue generated in Mission Bay Park exceeding \$23 million initially and decreasing	YES	
to \$20 million after 5 years be appropriated 75% for capital improvements in Mission Bay Park and 25% for capital improvements in Chollas Lake, Balboa, Mission Trails, Otay River Valley, Presidio and San Diego River Parks; open space parks; coastal beaches and contiguous coastal parks; and future regional parks? PROPOSITION D. MAKING ALCOHOL CONSUMPTION UNLAWFUL AT CITY BEACHES, MISSION BAY PARK, AND COASTAL PARKS. Shall the People of the City of San Diego amend San Diego Municipal Code section 56.54 to make the consumption of alcohol unlawful at City beaches, Mission Bay Park, and coastal parks?	YES

WHEREAS, a copy of the certificate of the Registrar of Voters of San Diego County canvassing the returns of the general municipal election and the special municipal election, as certified to the City Clerk, has been duly received; and

WHEREAS, a canvass of these elections has been completed and the City Clerk has certified the results to the City Council; and

WHEREAS, declaring the results of the election as certified by the Registrar of Voters and the City Clerk is a ministerial act required by California Elections Code section 10263 and, therefore, is not subject to veto by the Mayor; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of the City of San Diego, that the Council finds and determines, pursuant to the provisions of Section 27.0411 of the San Diego Municipal Code, as follows:

The whole number of votes cast in the City was 543,888.

The City Clerk is directed to file the following charter amendments with the Secretary of State in accordance with Government Code section 34460: adding Charter Section 55.2, designating the use of lease revenue from Mission Bay Park (Proposition C).

The City Clerk shall make public the results of the canvass of the municipal special election by publication of a copy of this resolution.
