DATE OF FINAL PASSAGE NOV 24 2009

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR, CHIEF OPERATING OFFICER, FIRE CHIEF, OR THE OFFICE OF HOMELAND SECURITY PROGRAM MANAGER TO APPLY FOR, ACCEPT, APPROPRIATE, AND EXPEND \$1,015,966 IN GRANT FUNDS UNDER THE FISCAL YEAR 2009 STATE HOMELAND SECURITY PROGRAM.

WHEREAS, the State Homeland Security Grant Program [SHSP] is a component of the United States Department of Homeland Security's 2009 Homeland Security Grant Program; and

WHEREAS, activities implemented under the SHSP support terrorism preparedness by building or enhancing capabilities that relate to the prevention of, protection from, response to and recovery from terrorism in order to be considered eligible; and

WHEREAS, activities implemented under the SHSP must align with national, state and urban area strategic objectives which include, in part, strengthening preparedness planning, expanding capabilities in improvised explosive device attack deterrence, prevention and protection, and maximizing information sharing; and

WHEREAS, the City of San Diego [City] is directly receiving \$995,966, and is eligible for up to \$20,000 for exercise reimbursement in additional funding, for a total of up to \$1,115,996, awarded through the County of San Diego as the core county for the San Diego region under the Fiscal Year [FY] 2009 SHSP; and

WHEREAS, the funding allocated to the City supports the San Diego Police Department, the San Diego Fire-Rescue Department, and the City's Office of Homeland Security by providing the means to enhance their preparedness, prevention and response capabilities; and

WHEREAS, the San Diego Police Department will fund equipment to enhance its capabilities for surveillance, physical security and protection of critical infrastructure sites, laboratory processes, investigations, and terrorist/criminal indicators, warning, and analysis systems, and acquire additional redundant interoperable communications equipment to ensure the provision of radio communications and situational awareness to first responders and command level personnel; and

WHEREAS, the San Diego Fire-Rescue Department will acquire personal protective equipment to enhance its structural firefighting, chemical, biological, radiological, nuclear, and explosive surge response capabilities; and

WHEREAS, the City's Office of Homeland Security will utilize planning funds to support the development of a City Continuity of Operations (COOP) Plan and supporting department level COOP plans, development of a City Recovery Plan that addresses service and site restoration operations, two site specific Mega Shelter Field Operations Guides to support citywide Care and Shelter operations, and Emergency Operations Center staff training; and

WHEREAS, there is no non-federal match or cost share required for grants under the State Homeland Security Grant Program covered by this resolution, however, this grant is reimbursable in nature requiring the City to expend funds prior to requesting reimbursement; and

WHEREAS, on October 14, 2009, the Public Safety and Neighborhood Services City Council Committee recommended approval of the City's participation in the FY 2009 SHSP;  
NOW THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:


1. That the Mayor, Chief Operating Officer, Fire Chief, or the Office of Homeland Security Program Manager is authorized, for and on behalf of the City, to apply for, accept, appropriate, and expend as the City's authorized agents up to \$1,015,966 in FY 2009 State Homeland Security Grant Program [SHSP] funding from the California Emergency Management Agency [CalEMA] via the County of San Diego Office of Emergency Services to assist in building and sustaining capabilities to prevent, protect against, respond to, and recover from threats or acts of terrorism, major disasters, and other emergencies.

2. That this authorization includes the execution of all aspects of fund and program operation, including any amendments, extensions, augmentations, additional funding or renewals; and to certify that the City will comply with all applicable statutory or regulatory requirements.

3. That the Chief Financial Officer, as delegated to Financial Management, is authorized to appropriate and the City Comptroller to expend up to \$1,015,966 in FY 2009 SHSP grant funds for defined grant purposes.

4. That the City Comptroller is authorized to establish a special interest-bearing fund for the grant.


