A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO WAIVING COUNCIL POLICY 900-15 AND AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO EXECUTE AN AGREEMENT WITH THE BUSINESS IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT COUNCIL.

WHEREAS, on June 8, 1999, the City Council adopted Resolution R-291758 which created Council Policy 900-15 to clarify the Small Business Enhancement Program's [SBEP] unique annual appropriation formula and to provide for accountability, efficiency, and flexibility in the administration of the program; and

WHEREAS, effective November 13, 2008, Council Policy 900-15 was revised to reflect evolving conditions and specifying that the appropriation formula is subject to a minimum of 80,000 small businesses registering in the City annually; and

WHEREAS, the revised Council Policy 900-15 provides, among other things, \$315,000 for BID Council Program Support and Operations, Micro-Districts and Commercial Neighborhoods Grants, and Technical Assistance; and

WHEREAS, in previous years, the BID Council Program Support and Operations, Micro-Districts and Commercial Neighborhoods Grants, and Technical Assistance was administered via an agreement with the BID Council for \$315,000; and

WHEREAS, considering the current economic climate, City staff has recommended that the money allocated for the agreement with the BID Council be reduced by \$30,000;NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of the City of San Diego, that:

- 1. That portion of Council Policy 900-15 specifying \$315,000 for BID Council Program Support and Operations, Micro-Districts and Commercial Neighborhoods grants and services, and Technical Assistance projects, is hereby waived for this current action.
- 2. The Mayor, or his designee, is authorized to to work with the BID Council on a reprioritized set of program services for the reduced amount and execute an agreement with the BID Council in an amount not to exceed \$285,000 for BID Council Program Support and Operations, Micro-Districts and Commercial Neighborhoods grants and services, and Technical Assistance projects.
- 3. The Chief Financial Officer, or his designee, is authorized to expend an amount not to exceed \$285,000 for the purpose of executing such agreement with the BID Council.
- 4. The Chief Financial Officer, or his designee, is authorized to transfer \$30,000 back into the appropriate General Fund reserves.
