A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL DECLARING
A CONTINUED STATE OF EMERGENCY REGARDING
THE LANDSLIDE ON MOUNT SOLEDAD.

WHEREAS, California Government Code section 8630 authorizes local governing bodies to proclaim local emergencies when such events occur as are defined by California Government Code section 8558(c); and

WHEREAS, effective January 1, 2010, Section 8630 further provides that the local governing body review the need for continuing the local emergency at least once every 30 days until the governing body terminates the local emergency; and

WHEREAS, on October 5, 2007, the City Council adopted Resolution No. R-303041 declaring the existence of a state of local emergency regarding the landslide on Mount Soledad and ratifying the Mayor's declaration of a state of local emergency of October 3, 2007; and


WHEREAS, the landslide continues to pose the possibility of peril to persons or property until remedial action is completed to stabilize the landslide and repair the affected property; and

WHEREAS, the City is undertaking measures to determine and implement remedial action to stabilize and repair the property affected by the landslide; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of the City of San Diego, that pursuant to California Government Code section 8630, a continued state of emergency is declared to persist relative to the landslide on Mount Soledad.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the measures previously authorized by the City Council in Resolution No. R-303041 shall continue to have full force and effect.
