A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO TO TRANSFER APPROPRIATIONS TO REIMBURSE THE ISAIAH PROJECT.

WHEREAS, the Fiscal Year 2011 Annual Appropriation Ordinance (Ordinance No. O-19976) provides that the Council may adopt a resolution authorizing the Chief Financial Officer to transfer appropriations from the General Fund Appropriated Reserve to other General Fund Departments; and

WHEREAS, Charter section 73 provides that, upon written recommendation of the Mayor, the Council may transfer all or part of an unencumbered balance of an appropriation to another purpose for which the current appropriation has proved insufficient; and

WHEREAS, in a memorandum dated January 25, 2011, Councilmembers Faulconer, Lightner, and Zapf requested that funds be allocated to The Isaiah Project to be used for portable restrooms and their maintenance; and

WHEREAS, previously each Council District had an allocation of Infrastructure

Improvement Funds that was returned to the general fund, and such funds are now available for reallocation; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor proposes that the City Council provide funding necessary to reimburse The Isaiah Project for providing portable restrooms for displaced or homeless individuals; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of the City of San Diego, that the Chief Financial Officer is authorized to transfer \$22,500 in expenditure appropriations from the General Fund Appropriated Reserve (Department #9915, Fund #100000) to the Council Administration

Department (Department #1151, Fund #100000) to reimburse The Isaiah Project which is providing portable restroom facilities to the displaced and homeless.
