A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO AUTHORIZING THE CITY TO APPLY FOR A CALIFORNIA OFFICE OF TRAFFIC SAFETY DUI ENFORCEMENT AND AWARENESS PROGRAM GRANT FOR THE PERIOD OF 10/1/2010 THROUGH 9/30/2011.

WHEREAS, the California Office of Traffic Safety DUI Enforcement and Awareness Program has initiated a grant for the period 10/1/2010 through 9/30/2011; and

WHEREAS, the object of the program will be to reduce the number of persons killed and injured in alcohol-related crashes; and

WHEREAS, the San Diego Police Department [SDPD] will employ various best-practice strategies including checkpoints, saturation patrols, stakeouts, and sting operations; and

WHEREAS, in order to reduce the persons killed and injured in alcohol-involved crashes, best-practice strategies will be conducted on an overtime basis. The funded strategies include DUI/Driver's License checkpoints and DUI saturation patrols. This program will also develop a "Hot Sheet" program and conduct stakeout operations for officers to concentrate on repeat offenders on probation who have had their license suspended or revoked. Sting operations will focus on DUI offenders with a suspended or revoked driver license who get behind the wheel after leaving court. Through warrant service details, SDPD will target repeat DUI violators who failed to appear in court or who violate probation. These strategies are designed to earn media attention thus enhancing the overall deterrent effect; and

WHEREAS, all expenses resulting from this action are grant funded; there is no requirement for continued expenditures or services once grant funding is depleted or terminated; and

WHEREAS, this activity is not subject to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to State CEQA Guidelines section 15060(c)(2); and

WHEREAS, this program is subject to the City's Equal Opportunity Contracting (San Diego Ordinance No. 18173, Section 22.2701 through 22.2708) and Non-Discrimination in Contracting Ordinance (San Diego Municipal Code Section Sections 22.3501 through 22.3517); NOW THEREFORE:

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Council of the City of San Diego hereby authorizes the Mayor or his representative to make application to the California Office of Traffic Safety, and to take all necessary actions to secure funding for an amount of \$427,000 pertaining to the DUI Enforcement and Awareness Program.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Council of the City of San Diego hereby authorizes the Chief Financial Officer to establish a special interest-bearing fund for the grants, if required.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Council of the City of San Diego hereby authorizes the Chief Financial Officer to accept up to \$427,000 or the actual amount of funding authorized by the California Office of Traffic Safety if the grant funding is secured.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Council of the City of San Diego hereby authorizes the Chief Financial Officer to appropriate and expend up to \$427,000 or the actual

amount of funding authorized by the California Office of Traffic Safety, for the purpose of implementing the DUI Enforcement and Awareness Program.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Council of the City of San Diego hereby authorizes the Chief of Police to administer and operate this program.
