A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO REGARDING THE FISCAL YEAR 2012 (FY 2012) COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT (CDBG) PROGRAM.

WHEREAS, the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974 established the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program, which is administered by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD); and

WHEREAS, the City of San Diego (City) has received CDBG Entitlement funds annually since its inception; and

WHEREAS, the overarching goal of the CDBG Program is to develop viable urban communities through the provision of decent housing, suitable living environments, and economic activities for persons of low and moderate-income; and

WHEREAS, the City has not yet received confirmation from HUD of the Federal entitlement amounts to be awarded to the City for FY 2012; and

WHEREAS, HUD has indicated that the City should proceed with an allocation process to meet the existing deadlines; and

WHEREAS, the City's staff has estimated that the City's CDBG entitlement grant for FY 2012 from HUD will be \$12,243,327, based on the entitlement amount awarded in FY 2011 by HUD; and

WHEREAS, in addition to this annual entitlement amount awarded by HUD, there is an additional \$639,465 available in CDBG program income available for allocation in FY 2012 as a result of the sale of property in Golden Hill previously purchased with CDBG funds, of which 15 percent or \$95,919 may be used towards funding projects in the Public Services category; and

WHEREAS, an additional \$3,294,500 will be available to fund eligible projects and programs approved for funding as a result of a repayment by the Redevelopment Agency of the City of San Diego (Agency) of CDBG debt pursuant to a City Council-approved ten-year Repayment Agreement By and Between the Redevelopment Agency of the City of San Diego and the City of San Diego regarding CDBG Debt filed on July 20, 2010, a copy of which is on file with the Office of the City Clerk as Document No. RR-305920 (Repayment Agreement); and

WHEREAS, based on the foregoing, the total estimated amount of CDBG funding currently available to the City Council for allocation for the FY 2012 CDBG Program is \$16,177,292, which consists of the estimated FY 2012 annual entitlement from HUD in the amount of \$12,243,327 plus the amount of the FY 2011 Agency repayment in the amount of \$3,294,500, and plus program income in the amount of \$639,465 from the sale of the Golden Hill property previously purchased with CDBG funds; and

WHEREAS, according to Council Policy 700-02, certain funding obligations (Funding Obligations) are to be deducted from the City's overall annual allocation prior to funding being made available to address other Consolidated Plan goals and these Funding Obligations totaling \$7,107,329 consist of Section 108 Loan Payments, Administration, and Public Services, which are set forth in detail in Report to City Council No. 11-034; and

WHEREAS, on March 10, 2011, Report to City Council No. 11-033 was provided to the City Council during a Special Joint Meeting of the Public Safety and Neighborhood Services Committee and City Council Committee of the Whole (Committee), setting forth a list of funding allocations and recommendations for the City's FY 2012 CDBG Program; and

WHEREAS, the Committee voted to forward staff recommendations in Report to City Council No. 11-033 to approve funding of those projects that had received five or more recommendations from the Council and the Committee also approved the decision to further allocate any additional remaining and available funds for the City's FY 2012 CDBG Program at the Council hearing on March 21, 2011; and

WHEREAS, based on the identification of additional sources of funding as directed by the Committee, there is sufficient funding to fully fund Brick and Mortar projects receiving four or more recommendations and Public Services projects receiving five or more recommendations, which will leave a remaining balance of \$261,237 in unallocated Brick and Mortar funds and \$95,919 in unallocated Public Services funds; and

WHEREAS, on March 21, 2011, the Council approved funding Brick and Mortar projects receiving four or more recommendations and Public Services projects receiving five or more recommendations and directed staff to return to Council with any and all remaining balances for final determination once HUD has provided the City with its actual CDBG entitlement amount for FY 2012; and

WHEREAS, Council Policy 700-02 governs the administration of the City's CDBG Program and requires in paragraph 17, that beginning with Fiscal Year 2012 allocations, the

City's Consolidated Plan Advisory Board (Board) will review applications and provide recommendations to the Council; and

WHEREAS, the Council is required to waive Council Policy 700-02 as it pertains to the foregoing provision because the Consolidated Plan Advisory Board is unable to review applications for the Fiscal Year 2012 allocations as a result of the recent appointment of the Board's members, there being an insufficient opportunity for the Board to meet and become fully educated on the CDBG process, and the existence of vacancies on the Board to an extent that the Board has recently been unable to meet due to a lack of quorum; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

- That the provisions of paragraph 17 of Council Policy 700-02 requiring
   Consolidated Plan Advisory Board review of applications and recommendations are waived.
- 2. That the Chief Financial Officer is authorized to accept CDBG funds from HUD for the City's FY 2012 CDBG Program.
- 3. That the Chief Financial Officer is authorized to accept the FY 2011 repayment of CDBG debt totaling \$3,294,500 by the Redevelopment Agency of the City of San Diego, which repayment shall be recorded as CDBG Program Income.
- 4. That the City's funding recommendations for the City's FY 2012 CDBG Program set forth in Attachment A to this resolution are approved, contingent upon the Chief Financial Officer certifying that funds are available.
- 5. That the City's Funding Obligations and those projects and programs approved for CDBG funding be incorporated into the City's FY 2012 Annual Action Plan.

- 6. That the Chief Financial Officer is authorized to appropriate and expend the CDBG funds for the City's Funding Obligations and those projects and programs approved for CDBG funding, contingent upon adoption of the FY 2012 Appropriation Ordinance and contingent upon the Chief Financial Officer certifying that funds are available.
- 7. That the Mayor or his designee is authorized to negotiate and execute agreements and any amendments thereto, with those agencies for which projects and programs have been approved for CDBG funding, contingent upon the Chief Financial Officer certifying that funds are available.
- 8. That in the event that the City receives more than \$12,243,327 of CDBG Entitlement funds in FY 2012, the Council shall be notified of the total amount available and shall determine additional funding allocations pursuant to Council Policy No. 700-02, utilizing the same result information presented at the first allocation hearing.
- 9. That the Mayor or his designee is authorized to suspend the initiation of new HUD Section 108 Loans during FY 2012 that rely on CDBG and/or General Funds as a repayment source.
