RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR OR HIS DESIGNEE TO MAKE APPLICATION TO THE INDIAN GAMING LOCAL COMMUNITY BENEFIT COMMITTEE, AND TO TAKE ALL NECESSARY ACTIONS TO SECURE FUNDING FOR AN AMOUNT OF \$147,533, IN GRANT FUNDS FOR THE PURCHASE OF AN ON-BOARD MOVING MAP FOR SAN DIEGO FIRE-RESCUE DEPARTMENT HELICOPTER 2.

WHEREAS, the San Diego Fire-Rescue Department [SDFD] currently owns and operates two medium lift, multi-mission helicopters which serve both to the City and County of San Diego. These two aircraft provide fire suppression, advanced life support, emergency medical transportation, and hoist rescue service on a constant basis within the county; and

WHEREAS, the SDFD Air Operations Division is proud to serve the tribal jurisdictions and their neighboring border jurisdiction through these mentioned services; and

WHEREAS, the SDFD helicopters regularly participate in training events with many tribal fire departments (Barona, Sycuan, and Viejas) further displaying our commitment to work together and be prepared for any type of emergency incident within tribal jurisdiction; and

WHEREAS, the challenge of aerial navigation to remote locations throughout the county can be made more efficient if SDFD helicopters are equipped with moving map technology; and

WHEREAS, moving maps are an onboard navigation system similar to a navigation system in a personal vehicle. A GPS coordinate, street address, pre-saved waypoint or commonly known location can be entered into the moving map system and a bearing can be followed which provide the aircrew the most expeditious route to follow to the incident locations; and

WHEREAS, the onboard moving map system also controls all of the associated camera systems. The Forward Looking Infrared ([FLIR], recordable camera, hoist camera, video downlink, and advanced mapping functions all run through the moving map system. This functionality not only assists the crew during a response, but can also be used by ground crews and command staff for situational awareness of an incident; and

WHEREAS, the SDFD has applied for the 2011 Indian Gaming Special Distribution

Fund [IGSDF] Grant for the amount of \$147,533 in order to purchase an on-board moving map

system for SDFD Helicopter 2. The IGSDF provides funding through grants to local government

jurisdictions for projects intended to mitigate the adverse effects of casinos; and

WHEREAS, an interest-bearing account must be set up for this grant; upon grant close, all remaining funds and interest earned must be returned to the IGSDF; and

WHEREAS, once purchased, SDFD will be responsible for maintaining the moving map system using funds from the department's operating budget. No other impacts to the general fund are expected; and

NOW THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mayor or his representative is authorized to make application to the Indian Gaming Local Community Benefit Committee, and to take all necessary actions to secure funding for an amount of \$147,533 in grant funds for the purchase of an onboard moving map system for San Diego Fire-Rescue Department Helicopter 2.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Chief Financial Officer is authorized to accept up to \$147,533 if the grant funding is secured.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Chief Financial Officer is authorized to establish a special interest-bearing account for the grant funds, if required.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Chief Financial Officer is authorized to appropriate and expend up to \$147,533 from grant funds, for the purpose of purchasing an onboard moving map system for San Diego Fire-Rescue Department Helicopter 2, contingent upon receipt of a fully executed grant agreement.
