A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR, OR HIS DESIGNEE, TO ACCEPT, APPROPRIATE, AND EXPEND \$582,000 IN GRANT FUNDS FROM THE FY 2009 BUFFER ZONE PROTECTION PROGRAM, AND AN ADDITIONAL \$380,000 IN GRANT FUNDS FROM THE FY 2010 BUFFER ZONE PROTECTION PROGRAM AS THE CITY'S AUTHORIZED AGENT, AND TO EXECUTE ALL AGREEMENTS NECESSARY TO COMPLY WITH THE FY2009 AND FY2010 BUFFER ZONE PROTECTION **PROGRAMS**

DATE OF FINAL PASSAGE

WHEREAS, the Buffer Zone Protection Program (BZPP) is one of several grant programs that constitute the Department of Homeland Security's (DHS) Federal Fiscal Year 2009 and 2010 focus on infrastructure protection activities; and

WHEREAS, the BZPP is one tool among a comprehensive set of measures authorized by Congress and implemented by the President to help strengthen the nation's critical infrastructure against risks associated with potential terrorist attacks; and

WHEREAS, the vast bulk of the United States' critical infrastructure is owned and/or operated by State, local, and private sector partners; and

WHEREAS, the funds provided by the BZPP increase the preparedness capabilities of jurisdictions responsible for the safety and security of communities surrounding high-priority Critical Infrastructure and Key Resource (CIKR) assets through allowable planning and equipment acquisition; and

WHEREAS, this program assists responsible jurisdictions in building effective prevention and protection capabilities that will make it more difficult for terrorists to conduct site surveillance or launch attacks within the immediate vicinity of CIKR assets; and

WHEREAS, the CIKR assets to be assessed and protected for Federal Fiscal Years 2009 and 2010 were previously identified by DHS, the State, and local authorities based on the risk of the individual sites themselves; and

WHEREAS, for Federal Fiscal Year 2009, three installations are located in the City of San Diego's (City) jurisdiction, and all three are public facilities; and

WHEREAS, for Federal Fiscal Year 2010, two installations are located within the City, one being public and the other private; and

WHEREAS, the Buffer Zone Plans for these specified sites have been prepared by the San Diego Police Department in cooperation with critical infrastructure site representatives, and DHS approved the completed plans; and

WHEREAS, funding up to \$582,000 for Federal Fiscal Year 2009 for the designated City's public sites and up to \$380,00 for Federal Fiscal Year 2010 for the identified public and private sector sites will be provided to reimburse the City for the preventative and protective measures implemented for these sites; and

WHEREAS, the BZPP initiative enhances public safety at no cost to the City; and WHEREAS, there is no non-Federal match or cost share required for grants under the program covered by this resolution; and

WHEREAS, these grants are reimbursable in nature requiring the City to expend the funds prior to requesting reimbursement; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the City Council of the City of San Diego, that the Mayor, Chief Operating Officer, Chief Financial Officer, Fire Chief, or the Office of Homeland Security Program Manager is authorized, on behalf of the City, to apply for, secure, accept, appropriate, and expend and amount not to exceed \$582,000 in grant funds from the FY2009 Buffer Zone Protection Program, and additionally \$380,000 in grant funds from the FY2010 Buffer Zone Protection Program as the City of San Diego's authorized agent, and to execute all agreements necessary to comply with the FY2009 and FY2010 Buffer Zone Protection Programs.
