A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR OR HIS DESIGNEE TO APPLY FOR, ACCEPT, APPROPRIATE, AND EXPEND \$176,145 IN FY 2012 EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT PERFORMANCE GRANT PROGRAM FUNDING FROM THE CALIFORNIA EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY AND TO EXECUTE ALL AGREEMENTS NECESSARY TO COMPLY WITH THE GRANT REQUIREMENTS

WHEREAS, the FY 2012 Emergency Management Performance Grant Program (EMPG) supports comprehensive emergency management at the state, tribal, and local levels and encourages the improvement of mitigation, preparedness, response, and recovery capabilities for all hazards; and

WHEREAS, the FY 2012 EMPG provides funding to further strengthen the City's ability to support emergency management mission areas while simultaneously addressing issues of national concern as identified in the National Priorities of the National Preparedness Guidelines; and

WHEREAS, funds provided under the program must support activities tied to the federally mandated whole community security and emergency management priority and related objectives; and

WHEREAS the following specific objectives apply to recipients of grant funds under the EMPG: 1) Develop and maintain a multi-year training and exercise plan to provide a roadmap to accomplish priorities described in our Homeland Security Strategy; and 2) Target training and verify capability of personnel to ensure the development of a professional emergency management workforce; and

WHEREAS, the City of San Diego meets the National Incident Management System compliance requirements for eligibility; and

WHEREAS, the EMPG is passed through the State of California to the County of San Diego; and

WHEREAS, the County of San Diego allocates a portion of the funds to the City of San Diego; and

WHEREAS, the City's Office of Homeland Security (OHS) will serve as the agent for the City to receive and expend the FY 2012 EMPG funds; and

WHEREAS, the City's one-hundred percent match will be provided through the General Fund personnel expense and non-personnel expense authorized under the appropriate annual City budget for the OHS; and

WHEREAS, EMPG funds may only be used for personnel, equipment, and activities that directly support all-hazard emergency management, including preparedness, response, recovery, and mitigation activities; and

WHEREAS, these activities must be approved by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), the State of California, and the County of San Diego prior to awards under the grant program; and

WHEREAS, OHS will be submitting an expenditure plan to allocate funding to support one non-General Fund full-time equivalent position for ongoing City Emergency Operations Center coordination, planning, equipment enhancements to the center, and emergency management exercises and training; and

WHEREAS, the FY 2012 EMPG requires a dollar-for-dollar cash or in kind match; and

WHEREAS, FEMA administers cost sharing requirements in accordance with 44 Code of Federal Regulations section 13.24; and

WHEREAS, the City's EMPG allocation amount is not to exceed \$176,145; and

WHEREAS, the required match for the City is provided by \$176,145 of the OHS
FY 2013 General Fund under the City's FY 2013 budget appropriation; and


WHEREAS, the FY 2012 EMPG provides funding to further strengthen the City's ability
to support emergency management mission areas while simultaneously addressing issues of
national concern as identified in the National Priorities of the National Preparedness Guidelines
at no cost to the City; NOW THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mayor, Chief Operation Officer, Chief Financial Officer,
Fire-Rescue Chief, or Office of Homeland Security Program Manager, are authorized, as the
City's authorized agents, to apply for, accept, appropriate, and expend \$176,145 in FY 2012
Emergency Management Performance Grant Program funding from the California Emergency
Management Agency via the County of San Diego Office of Emergency Services.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Mayor, Chief Operation Officer, Chief Financial
Officer, Fire-Rescue Chief, or Office of Homeland Security Program Manager, are also
authorized to execute all agreements necessary to comply with the Emergency Management
Grant Funding Program requirements.
