A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO AUTHORIZING THE ACCEPTANCE AND EXPENDITURE OF FEDERAL FUNDING FOR THE CAMINO DEL ESTE PEDESTRIAN CROSSING IMPROVEMENTS PROJECT.

WHEREAS, the Camino Del Este Pedestrian Crossing Improvements Project [Project] is located along the San Diego River Path system; and

WHEREAS, the Project will provide crossing facilities for pedestrians and bicyclists to safely cross Camino Del Estes; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

- 1. That the Mayor or his designee is authorized for and on behalf of the City to take all necessary steps to apply and secure grant funding for an amount not to exceed \$359,640 in Federal High Priority Demonstration (HPLU) funds under the SAFETEA-LU ACT, with the Department of Transportation (Caltrans) for the purposes of funding the Project.
- 2. That the Chief Financial Officer is authorized to accept, appropriate, and expend funds not to exceed \$359,640, for and on behalf of the City, if the grant funding is secured.
- 3. That the Chief Financial Officer is authorized to establish a special interest bearing account and to deposit grant funds received in such account, if the grant funding is secured.
- 4. That in accordance with the Annual Appropriation Ordinance, the Fiscal
 Year 2013 Capital Improvements Program Budget [CIP] is amended by increasing the CIP
 Budget in WBS A-IA.00001, Minor Bike Facilities, by an amount not to exceed \$359,640, State

Funds 600001, Federal Award, Grant #1000390-2013, for the purpose of funding the Project, contingent upon receipt of a fully executed grant agreement.
