A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO DETERMINING THAT THE APPROVAL OF THE STATE REVOLVING LOAN APPLICATION FOR ALVARADO PIPELINE SECOND EXTENSION AND MORENA BOULEVARD PIPELINE REPLACEMENT IS CATEGORICALLY EXEMPT FROM THE CALIFORNIA ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY ACT PURSUANT TO CEQA GUIDELINES SECTION 15302.

WHEREAS, the California Department of Public Health has funding available under the State Revolving Loan Program, which the City would use for the Alvarado Second Extension Pipeline and the Morena Boulevard Cast Iron Replacement (the Project); and

WHEREAS, the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) (Public Resources Code section 21000 et seq.), section 21084, states that the CEQA Guidelines thereto (California Code of Regulations, Title 14, Chapter 3, Section 15000 et seq.) shall list those classes of projects which have been determined not to have a significant effect on the environment and which shall be exempt from CEQA; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to that authority, CEQA Guidelines sections 15300 - 15333 list the categorical exemptions promulgated by the California Office of Planning and Research and adopted by the Secretary of the California Natural Resources Agency for those classes of projects which have been determined not to have a significant effect on the environment; and

WHEREAS, the City of San Diego Development Services Department has established that the Project is categorically exempt from CEQA pursuant to CEQA Guidelines section 15302 and that no exception to the exemption, as set forth in CEQA Guidelines section 15300.2, applies to the Project; and

determined that an exception to the exemption as set forth in CEQA Guidelines section 15300.2

does not apply.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City Clerk is directed to file a Notice of

Exemption regarding the Project with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors for the County of

San Diego.
