A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO ADOPTING A ZERO WASTE OBJECTIVE BY 2040 FOR THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO.

WHEREAS, California Public Resources Code sections 40051 and 41780 of the California Integrated Waste Management Act of 1989 (AB 939) require that all California jurisdictions achieve a landfill diversion rate of 50% by the year 2000, and reduce, reuse, recycle, and compost all discarded materials to the maximum extent feasible before any landfilling or other destructive disposal method is used; and

WHEREAS, AB 341, adopted in 2011, and set forth in California Public Resources Code section 41780.01 declares that it is the policy goal of the State that not less than 75% of solid waste generated be source reduced, recycled, or composted by the year 2020; and

WHEREAS, in 2001 the California Integrated Waste Management Board now known as California's Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery (CalRecycle) set a goal of Zero Waste in its strategic plan for the State; and

WHEREAS, CalRecycle has adopted "Zero Waste. You Make it Happen!" as the statewide slogan; and

WHEREAS, on November 13, 2012, the San Diego City Council adopted the Long-Term Resource Management Options Strategic Plan (LTRMOSP) which was developed to identify ways to maximize the life of the Miramar Landfill, and point out existing and new Zero Waste programs and evaluate alternate disposal options; and

WHEREAS, San Diego currently has an overall 68% waste diversion rate; and

WHEREAS, a recent waste composition study revealed that approximately 76% of all

waste currently disposed to the Miramar Landfill could be diverted from disposal; and

WHEREAS, the most environmentally sustainable resource management strategies

support resource recovery rather than disposal; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the City Council of the City of San Diego, that the City of San

Diego hereby adopts a Zero Waste objective for the City of San Diego with an initial goal of

diverting 75% of waste generated in the City from landfill disposal by 2020 and a goal of Zero

Waste by 2040, via the elimination of waste from landfill disposal and the diversion of

recyclable materials to reprocessing into usable forms with minimal transport, energy use, and

harm to society and the environment.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Environmental Services Department is

directed to develop a Zero Waste Plan in 2014 that establishes a framework for, and provides

guidance in, the City's planning and decision-making process so as to achieve the City's Zero

Waste objective, and return to the Natural Resources & Culture Committee with the draft plan.
