AN ORDINANCE OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO AUTHORIZING THE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT WITH HOME BREW MART, INC., DBA BALLAST POINT BREWING & SPIRITS CO. AND APPROVING CERTAIN RELATED ACTIONS

WHEREAS, Home Brew Mart, Inc., dba Ballast Point Brewing & Spirits Company
(Ballast Point) is the City's largest beer manufacturer, operating a production brewery, brewpub, and brewing equipment retail store, all located in San Diego; and

WHEREAS, Ballast Point currently maintains a 23,000 square foot main production brewery in the Scripps Miramar Ranch area of San Diego; and

WHEREAS, Council Policy 900-12 sets forth the City's Business and Industry Incentive Program (Incentive Program), which provides for flexible economic development incentives, and standards for use of the incentives, enabling the City to attract, retain, expand, or assist businesses or projects that meet both of the following criteria:

1. Either:

- a. Provide significant revenues and/or jobs that contribute to a sound and healthy economy;
- b. Promote the stability and growth of City taxes and other revenues;
- c. Encourage new business and other appropriate development in older parts of the City; or
- Respond to other jurisdictions' efforts to induce businesses to relocate
 from San Diego; and

2. Are consistent with the City's current adopted Community and Economic Development Strategy; and

WHEREAS, Ballast Point is currently constructing a large production brewery in the Miramar industrial area of San Diego, which is anticipated to be the sixth largest brewery in California; and

WHEREAS, Ballast Point is expected to create over 100 middle-wage job opportunities at this brewery, which are likely to be filled by San Diego County residents; and

WHEREAS, Ballast Point's new production brewery is expected to generate approximately \$50,000 annually in net new General Fund tax revenues to fund essential municipal services within the San Diego; and

WHEREAS, Ballast Point's substantial investment in property, facilities and equipment will greatly enhance the City's reputation as one of the nation's top locations for the manufacturing of beer; and

WHEREAS, Ballast Point's new brewery, because of its size, layout, and features, will anchor San Diego as a destination for beer tourism, thereby generating additional base sector jobs and tax revenues in and from local lodging and other service-sector establishments; and

WHEREAS, the manufacturing of beer generates 4.7 additional indirect and induced job opportunities within non-manufacturing sectors, for each direct manufacturing sector job, due to the extraordinarily high job creation multiplier of 5.7:1, thereby providing additional benefits to the local economy; and

WHEREAS, the City most likely would not receive certain tax revenues to be paid by Ballast Point in connection with the construction of operation of a large-scale brewery, had the expanded brewery been located outside San Diego, within another taxing jurisdiction; and

WHEREAS, Ballast Point ultimately selected a vacant factory site in San Diego for adaptive re-use, based in part upon the City's willingness to offer financial assistance to Ballast Point in accordance with the Incentive Program; and

WHEREAS, the City and Ballast Point have negotiated the terms of the Economic Development Agreement, included as Attachment 2 to Report to Council No. 14-032 (Agreement), memorializing the financial assistance offered to Ballast Point under the Incentive Program; and

WHEREAS, the Council has considered certain information regarding the Agreement and has held a public hearing as required by California Government Code section 53083; NOW THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

- 1. The Council finds that the attraction of investment from Ballast Point resulting from the financial assistance offered in the Agreement, as well as the anticipated retention and creation of important middle-wage job opportunities, generation of new tax revenues, and other economic public benefits, will serve public purposes and are in the best interests of the City.
- 2. The Council finds that the Ballast Point's proposed project meets the necessary public benefit criteria enumerated in Council Policy 900-12 to therefore justify the provision of financial assistance under the Incentive Program, such as the reimbursement of Ballast Point's development fees from project-generated tax revenues.
- 3. The Mayor, or his designee, is authorized and directed to execute the Agreement on the City's behalf and to take any and all actions necessary to implement the Agreement. A fully-executed copy of the Agreement shall be placed on file in the Office of the City Clerk as Document No. 20388.

The Chief Financial Officer is authorized to appropriate and expend funds as 4.

required per the terms of the Agreement, contingent upon adoption of future fiscal year

appropriation ordinances by the City Council and the Chief Financial Officer certifying that

funds are available, and provided that Ballast Point has delivered sufficient documentation to the

City substantiating Ballast Point's payment of local sales and use taxes or local property taxes, of

which the City receives a shared portion, to the State of California or the County of San Diego.

A full reading of this ordinance is dispensed with prior to its passage, a written or 5.

printed copy having been made available to the City Council and the public prior to the day of its

passage.

This ordinance shall take effect and be in force on the thirtieth day from and after 6.
