## RESOLUTION NUMBER R-309328

DATE OF FINAL PASSAGE NOV 2 5 2014

A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR AND CHIEF FINANCIAL OFFICER TO ACCEPT, APPROPRIATE, AND EXPEND \$2,830,880 IN GRANT FUNDING FROM THE CALIFORNIA BOARD OF STATE AND COMMUNITY CORRECTIONS (BSCC) TO PROVIDE ENHANCED FRONTLINE POLICE INTERVENTION PROGRAMS.

WHEREAS, in 2011, California Governor Jerry Brown signed Assembly Bill 109 (A.B. 109) which came to be known as the Public Safety Realignment Act; and

WHEREAS, the Bill is intended to reduce the population of low-level inmates cycling in and out of state prisons and allows non-violent, non-serious, non-sex offenders to serve their sentences in county jails instead of state prisons; and

WHEREAS, upon release, these offenders are placed into Post-Release Community
Supervision coordinated by the San Diego County Probation Department in cooperation with
local police agencies in the County; and

WHEREAS, in Fiscal Year 2013-14, the state budget included \$24 million which was distributed to cities and counties throughout the state to address front-line intervention services as a result of the increased burden on local police agencies and sheriff departments for Post-Release Community Supervision; and

WHEREAS, the state authorized the Board of State and Community Corrections (BSCC), in consultation with the Department of Finance, to disburse the funds on a formula-based allocation proposed by the California Police Chiefs Association; and

WHEREAS, the City of San Diego was selected to serve as the fiscal agent to disburse \$1,698,528 in funding last year, which was allocated to the municipal police agencies located within the County of San Diego (County), as well as the Sheriff's Department; and

WHEREAS, the BSCC delegated the determination of the disbursement methodology to the County's local law enforcement agencies; and

WHEREAS, the San Diego County Police Chiefs and Sheriffs Association (Association) agreed that the \$1,698,528 allocation would be distributed based upon the population of each respective city and unincorporated area of the County; and

WHEREAS, this formula provided \$714,005 to the City; and

WHEREAS, the County's municipal police agencies and the Sheriff entered into a Memorandum of Agreement, dated June 24, 2013, to memorialize the receipt and distribution of those funds; and

WHEREAS, the San Diego Police Department (Department) used this funding primarily for overtime operations conducted by patrol officers to target re-offending probationers in their respective divisions; and

WHEREAS, the City served as the fiscal agent for a second disbursement of \$1,946,230, which was also received in Fiscal Year 2014; and

WHEREAS, the Association agreed that the allocation of \$1,946,230 would be distributed using the same agreed-upon methodology; and

WHEREAS, this formula provided \$819,371 to the City; and

WHEREAS, the Department also used this funding primarily for overtime operations conducted by patrol officers to target re-offending probationers in their respective divisions; and

WHEREAS, the state's Fiscal Year 2014-15 budget includes an A.B. 109 allotment of \$2,830,880 for local police agencies in the County, which was received by the City in August 2014; and

WHEREAS, the Association recently agreed to revise the existing disbursement methodology to consider both the percentage of the general population, as determined by the County Department of Finance, and estimates of A.B. 109 offenders in each respective community; and

WHEREAS, the Association also agreed that the County would forego \$50,000 of its allocation and designate that amount to the City; and

WHEREAS, based upon this revised methodology, the City's allocation for Fiscal Year 2014-15 is \$1.139, 142, including \$50,000 from the County; and

WHEREAS, the Chief of Police is committed to the continued use of these funds to target re-offending probationers; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of the City of San Diego that the Mayor, or his designee, is authorized to accept from the California Board of State and Community Corrections \$2,830,880 in grant funds, and any subsequent funding through amendments or extensions, for a period of up to five years, from Fiscal Year 2015 through and including Fiscal Year 2019, provided funding is secured and made available by the California Board of State and Community Corrections, to implement A.B. 109 – the Public Safety Realignment Act – to specifically provide enhanced front-line police intervention programs.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Chief Financial Officer, or his designee, is authorized to appropriate and expend grant funding authorized by the California Board of State

and Community Corrections, including any amendments, extensions, or subsequent funding for a

period of up to five years, from Fiscal Year 2015 through and including Fiscal Year 2019,

provided funding is secured and made available by the California Board of State and Community

Corrections to implement A.B. 109 – the Public Safety Realignment Act – to specifically provide

enhanced front-line police intervention programs.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Chief Financial Officer, or his designee, is

authorized to serve as the Fiscal Agent and accept funds from the California Board of State and

Community Corrections, and to distribute funds to the Sheriff and other local police agencies

within the County of San Diego, as directed by the California Board of State and Community

Corrections, for a period of up to five years, from Fiscal Year 2015 through and including Fiscal

Year 2019, to implement A.B. 109 – the Public Safety Realignment Act – to specifically provide

enhanced front-line police intervention programs.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Chief Financial Officer is authorized to

appropriate and disburse \$1,691,738, or the amount based upon an agreed allocation formula, to

the San Diego County Sheriff's Department and other police agencies within the County, for a

period of up to five years, from Fiscal Year 2015 through and including Fiscal Year 2019,

provided funding is secured and made available by the California Board of State and Community

Corrections.
