AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 2, ARTICLE 6, DIVISION 19 OF THE SAN DIEGO MUNICIPAL CODE BY AMENDING SECTIONS 26.1902 AND 26.1903 RELATING TO THE COMPOSITION AND REPORTING REQUIREMENTS FOR THE COMMISSION ON GANG PREVENTION AND INTERVENTION.

WHEREAS, the San Diego Commission on Gang Prevention and Intervention (CGPI) was established in 2006 and serves as an advisory body to the Mayor and City Council on policy issues related to gang prevention, intervention, diversion, and suppression; and

WHEREAS, the CGPI's purpose is to develop a strategic, coordinated, and collaborative effort between the City, law enforcement agencies, social service providers, and the general public; and

WHEREAS, the CGPI consists of mayoral appointments drawn from a list of Councilmember nominees, individuals with certain expertise or background, and officeholders from law enforcement and various public and private agencies involved in gang-related issues; and

WHEREAS, the composition of the CGPI should reflect all law enforcement agencies involved in gang-related issues; and

WHEREAS, the United States Department of Justice (DOJ), Office of the United States

Attorney for the Southern District of California, is responsible for the federal prosecution of
gang-related criminal cases in the City of San Diego; and

WHEREAS, the DOJ has prioritized collaboration with local officials on issues related to gang prevention, intervention, diversion and suppression methods, and the identification of resources and best practices; and

WHEREAS, to achieve that collaboration, the United States Attorney for the Southern District of California (Attorney) desires to become an officeholder on the CGPI; and

WHEREAS, the Attorney will remain on the CGPI as long as he or she holds that office; and

WHERAS, the CGPI will increase from twenty to twenty-one members due to the addition of the Attorney; and

WHEREAS, the CGPI meets six times per year making quarterly reports to the Public Safety and Livable Neighborhood Committee difficult; and

WHEREAS, the CGPI wishes to change the reporting requirements to semi-annual reports; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. That Chapter 2, Article 6, Division 19 of the San Diego Municipal Code is amended by amending Sections 26.1902 and 26.1903, to read as follows:

# §26.1902 Commission on Gang Prevention and Intervention Established

- (a) There is hereby created a Commission on Gang Prevention and

  Intervention to consist of twenty-one members who shall serve without
  compensation. Members who are not officeholders shall be appointed by
  the Mayor and confirmed by the City Council. Commission members shall
  be residents of the City of San Diego unless the City Council makes a
  conscious exception.

- (c) The following officeholders shall be members of the Commission and no appointment is required:
  - (1) The Chief of Police for the City of San Diego

- (2) The Superintendent of the San Diego Unified School District
- (3) The San Diego County Sheriff
- (4) The San Diego County District Attorney
- (5) The San Diego County Chief of Probation
- (6) The Executive Director of the San Diego Association of Governments, also known as SANDAG
- (7) The President of the San Diego Workforce Partnership
- (8) The United States Attorney for the Southern District of California

## §26.1903 Duties and Functions

The Commission shall:

- (h) Present no less than semi-annual reports to the Public Safety and LivableNeighborhoods Committee of the City Council.

Section 3. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force on the thirtieth day from and after its final passage.
