A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO DETERMINING THAT THE AMENDMENTS TO THE EMERGENCY WATER REGULATIONS OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO MUNICIPAL CODE ARE EXEMPT FROM THE CALIFORNIA ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY ACT PURSUANT TO CEQA GUIDELINES SECTION 15061(b)(3) (GENERAL RULE).

WHEREAS, this action amends the Emergency Water Regulations of the San Diego Municipal Code, by amending sections 67.3802, 67.3803, 67.3804, 67.3805, 67.3806, and 67.3807, all relating to Emergency Water Regulations; and

WHEREAS, the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) (Public Resources Code section 21000 et seq.), section 21083, states that the CEQA Guidelines thereto (California Code of Regulations, Title 14, Chapter 3, Section 15000 et seq.) shall specifically include criteria for public agencies to follow in determining whether or not a proposed project may have a "significant effect on the environment;" and

WHEREAS, pursuant to that authority, CEQA Guidelines section 15061(b)(3) states that a project is exempt from CEQA, if the activity is covered by the general rule that CEQA applies only to projects which have the potential for causing a significant effect on the environment.

Where it can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the activity in question may have a significant effect on the environment, the activity is not subject to CEQA; and

WHEREAS, the Environmental Services Department staff has determined that the foregoing amendments to the Emergency Water Regulations of the SDMC are exempt from CEQA pursuant to CEQA Guidelines section 15061(b)(3) of the Guidelines for implementation of the California Environmental Quality Act; and

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of San Diego has considered the potential

environmental effects of the foregoing amendments to the Emergency Water Regulations of the

SDMC throughout the City of San Diego; and

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of San Diego, using its independent judgment, has

determined that there is no possibility that the foregoing amendments will have a significant

effect on the environment because the foregoing amendments will reduce the amount of water

used throughout the City; and

WHEREAS, this activity is exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act

(CEQA) pursuant to CEQA Guidelines section 15061(b)(3) because it can been seen with

certainty that there is no possibility this activity will result in a direct or reasonably foreseeable

indirect physical change in the environment; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the City Council of the City of San Diego, that the foregoing

amendments to the Emergency Water Regulations of the San Diego Municipal Code (SDMC)

are exempt from CEQA pursuant to CEQA Guidelines section 15061(b)(3).
