WHEREAS, on May 28, 2014, the California Legislature recognized that adverse childhood experiences, which include physical, emotional or sexual abuse, physical and emotional neglect, household dysfunction, untreated mental illness or incarceration of a household member, domestic violence, and separation or divorce involving household members, are traumatic experiences that can have a profound effect on a child's developing brain and body and can result in poor health during the person's adulthood (Assem. Conc. Res. No. 155, Stats. 2014 (2013-2014) Reg. Sess.) res. ch. 144, pp. 1-4); and

WHEREAS, studies show that the affects of such traumatic experiences are felt by people everywhere regardless of age, race, ethnicity, socio-economic status, gender, or work environment; and

WHEREAS, according to the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services

Administration (SAMHSA), a trauma-informed approach realizes the widespread impact of
trauma and understands potential paths for recovery; recognizes the signs and symptoms of
trauma in clients, families, staff, and others involved with the system; responds by fully
integrating knowledge about trauma into policies, procedures, and practices; and seeks to
actively resist re-traumatization; and

WHEREAS, the County of San Diego and the San Diego Unified School District have adopted a trauma-informed approach; and
