AN ORDINANCE OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO AUTHORIZING THE CITY TO EXTEND THE CONTRACT WITH TEGSCO, LLC D/B/A AUTORETURN FOR A COMPUTER OPERATED TOWING DISPTACH CENTER AND ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICES FOR THE TOWING PROGRAM, FOR A TERM OF MORE THAN FIVE YEARS.

WHEREAS, in 2008 the City of San Diego issued a Request for Proposal seeking a contractor to furnish the City with a computer operated towing dispatch center; and

WHEREAS, the City accepted a proposal from TEGSCO, LLC doing business as AutoReturn; and

WHEREAS, AutoReturn provides the management, towing dispatch, and software applications for towing services provided by contracted Licensed Tow Providers (LTP) and Licensed Impound Providers (LIP) to the City; and

WHEREAS, AutoReturn provides dispatch services, logistics, and oversight of nine LTPs and one LIP; and

WHEREAS, the contract with AutoReturn is cost-neutral because the cost of their services is offset by a portion of the tow franchise fees paid to the City by LIPs; and

WHEREAS, AutoReturn's contract is for five years and will expire on June 22, 2016; and

WHEREAS, the City would normally prepare a Request for Proposal, seeking bids for a new contract term; and

WHEREAS, on December 23, 2015, the City entered into an agreement with Intergraph Corporation to replace the San Diego Police Department's (Police Department) existing 25-year old antiquated Computer Aided Dispatch (CAD) System; and

WHEREAS, the CAD system contains many sub-systems and interfaces; and WHEREAS, one CAD system interface is with the AutoReturn towing dispatch system; and

WHEREAS, the AutoReturn dispatch system also interfaces with the CAD Message Switch, which routes data over wireless and ground-circuited networks between Mobile Computer Terminals (MCTs) and the CAD system; and

WHEREAS, the AutoReturn interface to the CAD system is very complex and required customized coding and enhancement to integrate it with all the different components; and

WHEREAS, with limited resources supporting the CAD system and the Message Switch in their present state, the Police Department cannot risk CAD outages that may impact the Police Department dispatch operations, public safety, or officer safety; and

WHEREAS, the Police Department cannot risk introduction of any new interfaces or new technology to the antiquated CAD system at this time, which would require major enhancements and modifications; and

WHEREAS, given that the new CAD system is scheduled to be online and operational in Fiscal Year 2018, it is prudent to extend the existing agreement with AutoReturn until the Department has a more stabilized, integrated, and fully supported CAD and MCT system, when the risks associated with making changes to interfaces will be greatly reduced; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to San Diego Municipal Code section 22.3016, the Purchasing Agent certified that the award of a sole source contract to AutoReturn is necessary and strict compliance with a competitive process would be impractical; and

WHEREAS, on February 25, 2016, the Director of Purchasing and Contracting approved for three years the Police Department's sole source request to extend AutoReturn's contract, due to the public safety, mission critical nature of the CAD system; and

WHEREAS, the Police Department requests an extension of the original agreement with

AutoReturn beyond five years; and

WHEREAS, there is no cost to the City associated with this contract extension; and

WHEREAS, under San Diego Charter section 99, no contract, agreement or obligation

extending for a period of more than five years may be authorized except by ordinance adopted by

a two-thirds' majority vote of the City Council; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. That the Mayor or his designee is authorized to execute for and on behalf of

the City a contract Amendment with TEGSCO, LLC, doing business as AutoReturn, for the

management of the Computer Operated Towing Dispatch Center, extending the existing

five-year agreement for two years, with an option to renew for one additional one-year period.

Section 2. That a full reading of this ordinance is dispensed with prior to passage, a

written copy having been made available to the City Council and the public prior to the day of its

passage.

Section 3. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force on the thirtieth day from

and after its final passage.
