AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 6, ARTICLE 5, DIVISION 2 OF THE SAN DIEGO MUNICIPAL CODE BY AMENDING SECTIONS 65.0206, 65.0217, AND 65.0221, ALL RELATING TO MAINTENANCE ASSESSMENT DISTRICTS.

WHEREAS, on June 1, 2016, the City Council passed Ordinance No. O-20653, amending Chapter 6, Article 5, Division 2 of the San Diego Municipal Code relating to Maintenance Assessment Districts (MADs); and

WHEREAS, those amendments addressed, among other things, a petition requirement for establishing a MAD, selecting an administrator for a MAD, and disestablishing a MAD; and

WHEREAS, the language regarding the petition requirement threshold references property owners who own 30 percent of the property within the MAD, which could be interpreted to mean a measurement of area instead of the intended measurement of individual parcels; and

WHEREAS, this ordinance is necessary to correct that unintended ambiguity; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. That Chapter 6, Article 5, Division 2 of the San Diego Municipal Code is amended by amending sections 65.0206, 65.0217, and 65.0221, to read as follows:

# §65.0206 Establishment of a District

A *district* may be established as provided in this Division, in the following manner:

- (e) Upon the submission of a written petition supporting the approved district management plan, signed by the property owners who own at least 30 percent of the total number of assessable parcels in the proposed district, as identified in the district management plan or engineer's report, or those property owners who would pay at least 30 percent of the proposed assessments to be generated in the proposed district, the City may initiate proceedings to establish a district. The petition shall contain a map showing the boundaries of the district, a general summary of the types of improvements and activities that will be provided within the district, the exact cost to the respective property owner and their proportional weight relative to the total budget proposed for the new district which will fund the costs of providing such improvements and activities.

# §65.0217 Administration by an Owners' Association

- (c) Upon the submission of a written petition, signed by the *property owners* who own at least 30 percent of the total number of assessed parcels in the *district*, as identified in the *district management plan* or *engineer's report*, or those *property owners* who pay at least 30 percent of the *assessments* generated in the *district*, the City may initiate proceedings to change the administrator of a *district*. If the *district* is currently administered by the City, the petition shall include a statement that the *property owners* desire

to have an *owners' association* administer the *district*. If the *district* is currently administered by an *owners' association*, the petition will include a statement as to whether the *property owners* desire the City or another *owners' association* to administer the *district*.
