A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO AUTHORIZING AN APPLICATION TO THE CALIFORNIA DEPARTMENT OF HOUSING AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT TO SECURE HOUSING-RELATED PARKS ROUND FIVE GRANT FUNDS FOR THE GUYMON NEIGHBORHOOD PARK AND HORTON ELEMENTARY SCHOOL JOINT USE AREA CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECT, AND RELATED ACTIONS.

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WHEREAS, in November 2006, the California voters passed the Housing and Emergency Shelter Trust Fund Act of 2006 (Proposition 1C); and

WHEREAS, this Act authorized the California Department of Housing and Community

Development (HCD) to administer \$200 million to fund the Housing-Related Parks (HRP)

Program; and

WHEREAS, the HRP Program is designed to encourage cities and counties to develop new low income housing by rewarding those jurisdictions with grant funds for the creation, development, or rehabilitation of park and recreation facilities; and

WHEREAS, this award program does not use a competitive process to award funds; all jurisdictions who meet the eligibility requirements will be funded; and

WHEREAS, the HRP funds are awarded on a per-bedroom basis for each affordable, very low and low-income residential unit with documented housing starts since the time of the last application cycle; and

WHEREAS, the HCD has issued a Notice of Funding Availability (NOFA) dated October 26, 2015, under its Housing-Related Parks Program; and

WHEREAS, the 2015 funding is the fifth cycle; and

WHEREAS, the Guymon Neighborhood Park and Horton Elementary School Joint Use Area Capital Improvement Project provides for the development and construction of approximately 1.4 useable acres of Joint Use Area and 0.7 acres of Guymon Neighborhood Park includes, but is not limited to children's playgrounds, adult exercise equipment, picnic shade structure, turf and planting on 4.8 acres of City parkland; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the City Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

- 1. The Mayor or his designee is authorized and directed to make an application to the California Department of Housing and Community Development and to take all necessary actions, including entering into, executing, and delivering a State of California Standard Agreement, to secure funding for an amount not to exceed \$7,000,000 in Housing-Related Parks Round Five funds for park and recreation improvements in the City Heights community.
- 2. The Chief Financial Officer is authorized to accept, appropriate, and expend an amount not to exceed \$7,000,000 of Housing-Related Parks Round Five grant funds, if the grant funding is secured and upon receipt of a fully executed grant agreement.
- 3. The Chief Financial Officer is authorized to establish a special interest-bearing account, if required.
- 4. The City shall be subject to the terms and conditions specified in the Standard Agreement. Funds are to be used for allowable capital asset project expenditures to be identified in Exhibit A of the Standard Agreement. The application in full is incorporated as part of the Standard Agreement. Any and all activities funded, information provided, and timeliness represented into the application are enforceable through the Standard Agreement. The City hereby agrees to use the funds for eligible capital asset(s) in the manner presented in the

5. The Chief Financial Officer is authorized to add CIP #S-16045, Guymon

Neighborhood Park and Horton Elementary School Joint Use Area Capital Improvement Project

to the Capital Improvements Program.

The Chief Financial Officer is authorized to increase the Capital Improvements 6.

Program Budget in CIP #S-16045 Guymon Neighborhood Park and Horton Elementary School

Joint Use Capital Improvement Project, and to appropriate and expend \$660,656 from Fund

No. 200636, Developer Contribution-CIP, for the purposes of providing Engineer services.

7. The Chief Financial Officer is authorized to increase the Capital Improvements

Program Budget in CIP #S-16045 Guymon Neighborhood Park and Horton Elementary School

Joint Use Capital Improvement Project, and to appropriate and expend an amount not to exceed

\$7,000,000 from Fund No. 600001 of Housing Related Parks Round Five grant funds, contingent

upon the receipt of a fully executed grant agreement.
