A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO PURSUANT TO SECTION 147(f) OF THE INTERNAL REVENUE CODE OF 1986 APPROVING THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS BY THE HOUSING AUTHORITY OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO FOR CORONADO TERRACE.

WHEREAS, the Housing Authority of the City of San Diego (Authority) intends to issue not to exceed \$97,000,000 aggregate principal amount of multifamily housing revenue bonds (Bonds) to finance the acquisition, rehabilitation and equipping of Coronado Terrace, a multifamily affordable housing project in the City of San Diego (City) described in the Notice of Public Hearing attached as Exhibit A hereto (Project); and

WHEREAS, in order for interest on the Bonds to be tax-exempt, section 147(f) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (Code) requires that the Bonds be approved by the City Council as the applicable elected representative after a public hearing following reasonable public notice; and

WHEREAS, notice of a public hearing with respect to the proposed issuance of the Bonds was published in a newspaper of general circulation in the City on October 7, 2016; and

WHEREAS, the public hearing was held on October 25, 2016, and an opportunity was provided for interested persons to express their views on the issuance of the Bonds and on the nature and location of the Project; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the City Council of the City of San Diego that this City Council, as the applicable elected representative under section 147(f) of the Code, approves the issuance of the Bonds by the Authority.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City does not warrant the creditworthiness of the Bonds or guarantee, in any way, the payment of the Bonds. No moneys of the City will be pledged or applied to the repayment of the Bonds.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the proposed rehabilitation is categorically exempt from the requirements of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to section 15301 of the State CEQA Guidelines because the Project is an existing facility and the proposed actions do not involve expansion of the existing use. The Project meets the criteria set forth in CEQA section 15301(a), which allows for exterior and interior alterations of existing facilities. Processing under the National Environmental Policy Act is not required as there are no federal funds involved with this Project.
