A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR OR HIS DESIGNEE TO APPLY FOR AND TO TAKE ALL NECESSARY ACTIONS TO SECURE FUNDING FROM THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE OFFICE OF JUSTICE PROGRAMS 2016 NATIONAL CRIME STATISTICS EXCHANGE IMPLEMENTATION ASSISTANCE PROGRAM: PHASE III – SUPPORT FOR LARGE LOCAL AGENCIES GRANT.

WHEREAS, the U.S Department of Justice Office of Justice Programs has made available grant funding to local law enforcement agencies for the implementation of the FBI's National Incident-Based Reporting System (NIBRS); and

WHEREAS, NIBRS was developed in the mid-1980s with the goal of enhancing crime data collected and reported by law enforcement; and

WHEREAS, NIBRS expands the number of categories of crime, and provides detailed data and relationships for each incident, rather than summary statistics; and

WHEREAS, the lack of meaningful participation in NIBRS, particularly by large agencies that represent significant portions of the nation's population, has not allowed NIBRS to reach its full potential; and

WHEREAS, to remedy this issue, the National Crime Statistic's Exchange (NCS-X) initiative was created; and

WHEREAS, the goal of NCS-X is to insure the country will have a nationally representative system of incident-based crime statistics drawn from the operational data system of local police departments, which will allow for more detailed and transparent descriptions of crime in the communities; and

WHEREAS, in June 2016, the San Diego Police Department (Police Department) submitted a grant application to the U.S. Department of Justice Office of Justice Programs for the National Crime Statistic Exchange Implementation Assistance Program: Phase III – Support for Legal Local Agencies; and

WHEREAS, currently, Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) is compiled by the Automated Regional Justice Information System (ARJIS) for all agencies in the San Diego region, promoting consistency in data and reporting quality; and

WHEREAS, the Police Department collects and sends data using its current custom-built records management system, the Criminal Records Management System (CRMS), which includes the ability to collect incident level data, but does not include all of the required data elements and relationships required by NIBRS; and

WHEREAS, several local agencies, including the San Diego Sheriff's Department, utilize Motorola's NetRMS solution to collect incident data that is shared with ARJIS through a standardized interface; and

WHEREAS, this grant will assist the Police Department with the implementation of NetRMS, in order to collect the data required for NIBRS reporting, and will enable ARJIS to validate the NIBRS data and implement NIBRS reporting capabilities for local San Diego agencies that provide data to ARJIS; and

WHEREAS, the total cost of the project, called the San Diego Regional NIBRS

Transition Project, is expected to be \$2,958,301, with \$2,682,434 awarded by the grant; and

WHEREAS, the Police Department will include the remaining \$275,867 in its FY 2018

and FY 2019 budget requests to fund the licensing of any required third-party components and

cover the first year costs of maintenance of NetRMS for the Police Department; and NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the City Council of the City of San Diego, that the Mayor or his representative is authorized, for and on behalf of the City to accept \$2,682,434 in grant funds from U.S. Department of Justice Office of Justice Programs 2016 National Crime Statistics Exchange Implementation Assistance Program: Phase III – Support for Large Local Agencies.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Mayor or his representative is authorized, for and behalf of the City, to apply for and to take all necessary actions to secure funding from U.S. Department of Justice Office of Justice Programs 2016 National Crime Statistics Exchange Implementation Assistance Program: Phase III – Support for Large Local Agencies Grant, including any amendments, extensions or renewals of the grants for a period of up to five years, provided funding is secured and made available.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Chief Financial Officer is authorized to establish a special interesting-bearing fund for the grants, if required.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the Chief of Police or designee is authorized to administer and operate the U.S. Department of Justice Office of Justice Programs 2016 National Crime Statistics Exchange Implementation Assistance Program: Phase III – Support for Large Local Agencies Grant.
