A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO PURSUANT TO SECTION 147(f) OF THE INTERNAL REVENUE CODE OF 1986 APPROVING THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS BY THE HOUSING AUTHORITY OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO FOR PACIFIC HIGHLANDS RANCH VILLAGE.

WHEREAS, the Housing Authority of the City of San Diego (Authority) intends to issue not to exceed \$24,000,000 aggregate principal amount of multifamily housing revenue bonds (Bonds) to finance the acquisition, construction and equipping of Pacific Highlands Ranch Village, a multifamily affordable housing project in the City of San Diego (City) described in the Notice of Public Hearing attached as Exhibit A hereto (Project); and

WHEREAS, in order for interest on the Bonds to be tax-exempt, section 147(f) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (Code) requires that the Bonds be approved by the City Council as the applicable elected representative after a public hearing following reasonable public notice; and

WHEREAS, notice of a public hearing with respect to the proposed issuance of the Bonds was published in a newspaper of general circulation in the City on February 15, 2017; and

WHEREAS, the public hearing was held on March 6, 2017, and an opportunity was provided for interested persons to express their views on the issuance of the Bonds and on the nature and location of the Project; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the City Council of the City of San Diego that this City Council, as the applicable elected representative under section 147(f) of the Code, approves the issuance of the Bonds by the Authority.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City does not warrant the creditworthiness of the Bonds or guarantee, in any way, the payment of the Bonds. No moneys of the City will be pledged or applied to the repayment of the Bonds.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City as Lead Agency under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) has prepared and completed Master Environmental Impact Report (MEIR) Findings for Project No. 317590 (Findings to MEIR No. 96-7918/SCH No. 97111077), dated October 23, 2013. Based on the initial study, the City has determined that the project would not cause any significant effect on the environment not examined in the previously certified Master Environmental Impact Report, that no additional significant environmental effect will result from the proposal, no new additional mitigation measures or alternatives may be required, and that the project is within the scope of the Master EIR. Processing under the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) is not required as there are no Federal funds involved with this action.
