A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO DETERMINING THAT APPROVAL OF THE FIRST AMENDMENT TO THE AGREEMENT WITH TETRA TECH BAS FOR ENGINEERING AND PERMITTING CONSULTANT SERVICES FOR COMPLIANCE AND CAPACITY AT THE MIRAMAR LANDFILL IS CATEGORICALLY EXEMPT FROM THE CALIFORNIA ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY ACT PURSUANT TO CEQA GUIDELINES SECTION 15306.

WHEREAS, on October 15, 2012, the City of San Diego (City) entered into an agreement with Tetra Tech BAS for engineering and permitting consultant services related to compliance and capacity at the Miramar Landfill (Agreement); and

WHEREAS, the City desires to enter into the First Amendment to the Agreement, to add funding in an amount not to exceed \$20,000 and to extend the Agreement term through November 14, 2021, for the purpose of completing the Scope of Services (the Project); and

WHEREAS, the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) (Public Resources Code section 21000 et seq.), section 21084, states that the CEQA Guidelines thereto (California Code of Regulations, Title 14, Chapter 3, Section 15000 et seq.) shall list those classes of projects which have been determined not to have a significant effect on the environment and which shall be exempt from CEQA; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to that authority, CEQA Guidelines sections 15300-15333 list the categorical exemptions promulgated by the California Office of Planning and Research and

adopted by the Secretary of the California Natural Resources Agency for those classes of Projects which have been determined not to have a significant effect on the environment; and

WHEREAS, the Development Services Department has established that the Project is categorically exempt from CEQA pursuant to CEQA Guidelines section 15306 (Information Collection), and that no exception to the exemption, as set forth in CEQA Guidelines section 15300.2, applies to the Project; and

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of San Diego has considered the potential environmental effects of the Project; and

WHEREAS, the City Council held a duly noticed public meeting and considered the written record for the Project as well as public comment; and

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of San Diego, using its independent judgment, has determined that the Project will not have a significant effect on the environment as the Project is the First Amendment to the Agreement for engineering and permitting consultant services related to compliance and capacity at the Miramar Landfill, which involves the development of engineering drawings, plans, and technical documents, and that does not result in a serious or major disturbance to an environmental resource; NOW THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Council of the City of San Diego determines that the Project is categorically exempt from CEQA pursuant to CEQA Guidelines section 15306.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Council of the City of San Diego has determined that an exception to the exemption as set forth in CEQA Guidelines section 15300.2 does not apply.
