A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO EXECUTE A FOURTH AMENDMENT WITH RURAL/METRO CORPORATION FOR THE PROVISION OF EMERGENCY MEDICAL AND TRANSPORT SERVICES.

WHEREAS, the City's emergency medical services (EMS) system is experiencing a rapid increase in demand for ambulance transports, including an increase in non-urgent transportation requests; and

WHEREAS, in order to address these challenges and keep the City's EMS system functioning at an appropriate level, the City and AMR desire to amend the 2011 EMS Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the amended 2011 EMS Agreement will terminate when a new EMS contract resulting from a planned 2018 request for proposals is awarded; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the City Council of the City of San Diego, that the Mayor or his designee is authorized to execute, for and on behalf of the City, an amendment to the current Emergency Medical Services Agreement with Rural/Metro Corp., under the terms and conditions set forth in the amendment entitled "Fourth Amendment to 2011 Emergency Medical Services Agreement," on file with the City Clerk as document number RR 311378

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a new article VII section 7.9 will be added to this amendment requiring Rural/Metro Corp. to provide monthly reports on the City's EMS system to each City Council Member's office.

(R-2018-119 REV.)

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this amendment will include a requirement that any final compliance measures and response time tiers made during the amendment's ninety-day Adjustment Period be brought before the City Council for review after that period ends.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the current Emergency Medical Services Agreement with Rural/Metro Corp. is referred as a potential audit to the Audit Committee and the City - Auditor for review and consideration at the City Auditor's discretion.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that City staff continue to work with the County of San Diego, the insurers, and major health plans in the County of San Diego on alternative transportation options for non-emergency calls.

I am submitting this memorandum with a revised copy of the resolution for Item 330, heard on October 24, 2017, because the resolution was revised during this item's hearing at City Council. The revisions include the following alterations to the original resolution:
