A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO DECLARING ITS OFFICIAL INTENT TO REIMBURSE ITSELF FROM THE PROCEEDS OF TAXEXEMPT LEASE-PURCHASE OBLIGATIONS.

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of San Diego, California (City) expects and intends to finance, in whole or in part, to acquire and outfit a Sikorsky S70i Fire/Rescue Helicopter (Project); and

WHEREAS, the City expects to borrow funds on a tax-exempt basis to finance all or a portion of the cost of the Project (Obligations) in an amount not to exceed \$20 million; and

WHEREAS, the City expects to expend moneys (other than moneys derived from the proceeds of tax-exempt obligations) on expenditures relating to the costs of the Project prior to incurring the Obligations, which expenditures will be properly chargeable to a capital account under general federal income tax principles; and

WHEREAS, the City reasonably expects to reimburse certain of such capital expenditures with the proceeds of the Obligations; and

WHEREAS, at the time of the reimbursement, the City will evidence the reimbursement in a writing which identifies the allocation of the proceeds of the Obligations to the City for the purpose of reimbursing the City for any of the capital expenditures made prior to the issuance of the Obligations; and

WHEREAS, the City expects to make the reimbursement allocation no later than eighteen (18) months after the later of (i) the date on which the earliest original expenditure is paid (ii) the date on which the Project is placed in service (or abandoned), but in no event later than three (3) years after the date on which the earliest original expenditure is paid; and

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WHEREAS, the City will not, within one (1) year of the reimbursement allocation, use

the proceeds of the Obligations received in the reimbursement allocation in a manner that will

result in the creation of replacement proceeds of the Obligations or another issue (e.g., the City

will not pledge or use the proceeds received for the payment of debt service on the Obligations

or another issue); and

WHEREAS, the Resolution is intended to be a "declaration of official intent" in

accordance with Section 1.150-2 of the Treasury Regulation; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of the City of San Diego as follows:

This City Council finds and determines that the forgoing recitals are true and 1.

correct.

That this Declaration of Intent is made solely for the purpose of establishing 2.

compliance with section 1.150-2 of the Treasury Regulations, and in accordance therewith the

City declares its intention to incur Obligations, the proceeds of which will be used to pay, or

whole or in part, for the costs of the Project (and related issuance costs, if any), including the

reimbursement to the City for certain capital expenditures relating to the Project made prior to

incurring the Obligations, provided however that this Declaration of Intent does not bind the City

to make any expenditure, incur any indebtedness, or proceed with the Project.

This Declaration of Intent shall take effect from and after the date of its adoption. 3.
