AN ORDINANCE OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO FOR AUTHORIZATION TO NEGOTIATE AND EXECUTE A CONTRACT FOR AN OWNER-CONTROLLED INSURANCE PROGRAM FOR THE NORTH CITY PURE WATER PHASE 1 PROJECT.

WHEREAS, the Pure Water Program is a phased, multi-year program that uses proven technology to produce a safe, reliable and cost-effective water supply for the City. At full implementation in 2035, the Program will provide one-third (1/3) of San Diego's water supply locally and will reduce the City's ocean wastewater discharges by approximately one-half (1/2); and

WHEREAS, on April 10, 2018, the San Diego City Council approved the North City

Pure Water Project – Phase I (Project), which included discretionary land use approvals and an

Environmental Impact Report. The Project is comprised of several projects that will deliver 30

million gallons per day of purified water from the Morena Pump Station to the Miramar

Reservoir; and

WHEREAS, Owner-Controlled Insurance Programs (OCIPs) have been utilized in many large public works programs. The key benefits of an OCIP are economies of scale, improved claims management and a uniform safety program, which in turn leads to savings. Coverage is consistent, and claims administration is centralized with one insurance provider for the entire program; and

WHEREAS, through the implementation of an OCIP, the City will furnish workers' compensation, general, excess, pollution liability, and builder's risk insurance associated with

the construction of Pure Water Phase 1. The insurance will cover the City, the prime contractors, and all subcontractors at all tiers; and

WHEREAS, the insurance contract will be a fifteen (15) year contract. The initial insurance coverage period will be for up to five years to cover the construction activities from Contractor Notice-To-Proceed (NTP) until Notice of Completion (NOC). At the NOC date, the Builder's Risk policy will end coverage. General Liability and Workers' Compensation will have an additional 10-year period starting at the NOC date to process claims. At the end of the 10-year "tail," the General Liability policy will end. The City will have the option to close all Workers' Compensation claims and buy out any future exposure to keep the Workers' Compensation policy from being in force in perpetuity; and

WHEREAS, the City intends to seek an OCIP carrier in compliance with all competitive bid requirements of the San Diego Municipal Code. Proposals will be evaluated based on qualifications, anticipated claims, anticipated losses, best apparent value, and cost; and

WHEREAS, the estimated cost for the OCIP is \$28,230,660;

WHEREAS, under Charter section 99, no contract, agreement or obligation extending for a period of more than five years may be authorized except by Ordinance approved by a two-thirds majority vote of the City Council; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. That the Mayor, or his designee, is authorized to negotiate and execute, for and on behalf of the City, a contract for an Owner-Controlled Insurance Program for the Phase 1 Pure Water Program in an amount not to exceed \$28,230,660, contingent upon adoption of the Annual Appropriation Ordinance for the applicable fiscal year, and contingent upon the Chief Financial Officer furnishing one or more certificates certifying that funds necessary for

expenditure are, or will be, on deposit with the City Treasury, under substantial the same the terms and conditions identified herein.

Section 2. That the Chief Financial Officer is authorized to expend the amount, in total, not to exceed \$28,230,660, estimated to be spent as:

- \$25,425,456 from CIP ALA.00001, Pure Water Program (B-15139, North City Pure Water Facility; B-15140, North City Pure Water Pump Station; B-15141, NC Morena Blvd Pump Station & Pipelines; B-15142, NCWRP Expansion; B-16035, North City Pure Water Pipeline; B-16140, NCPWF Influent Pump Station and Pipeline; B-17006, NC-MBC Improvements; B-17190, Miramar Reservoir Pump Station Improvements), Fund 700010, Water Utility CIP, and Fund 700009, Metro Sewer CIP;
- \$556,856 from CIP AKB.00003, Water Main Replacements (B-17153, AC Water Group 1038), Fund 700010, Water Utility CIP;
- \$782,082 from CIP S-16027, Morena Pipeline, Fund 700010, Water Utility CIP;
- \$702,807 from CIP S-17012, NCWRP Improvements to 30 MGD, Fund 700009, Metro Sewer CIP;
- \$731,921 from CIP S-17013, MBC Equipment Upgrades, Fund 700009, Metro Sewer CIP;
- \$31,538 from CIP S-00880, Miramar Road I-805 Easterly Ramps, Fund 400169, Transnet Extension 70% Cap, Fund 400174, Transnet Extension RTCI Fee, and Fund 400869, General Fund Commercial Paper Notes;

for the purpose of funding an Owner-Controlled Insurance Program for the Phase 1 Pure Water Program, contingent upon adoption of the Annual Appropriation Ordinance for the applicable fiscal year, and contingent upon the Chief Financial Officer furnishing one or more certificates certifying that funds necessary for expenditure are, or will be, on deposit with the City Treasury. provided that the Chief Financial Officer furnishes one or more certificates demonstrating that the funds for this expenditure are, or will be, on deposit in the City Treasury.

Section 3. That the Chief Financial Officer is authorized, upon advice from the administering department, to transfer excess budgeted funds, if any, to the appropriate reserves.

Section 4. That a full reading of this ordinance is dispensed with prior to passage, a written copy having been made available to the Council and the public prior to the day of its passage.

Section 5. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force on the thirtieth day from and after its final passage.
