A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO DETERMINING THAT AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR OR HIS DESIGNEE TO SELL CERTAIN EXCESS CITY PROPERTY LOCATED AT 7410 AND 7412 CUVIER STREET; AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR OR HIS DESIGNEE TO ENTER INTO AGREEMENTS TO CONSUMMATE THE SALE; AND AUTHORIZING THE CHIEF FINANCIAL OFFICER TO ACCEPT AND DEPOSIT THE INDEPENDENT CONSIDERATION AND THE PROCEEDS OF THE SALE IS CATEGORICALLY EXEMPT FROM THE CALIFORNIA ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY ACT PURSUANT TO CEQA GUIDELINES SECTION 15312.

WHEREAS, the City of San Diego is considering the sale of approximately 19,515 square feet of real property (Property), located at 7410 and 7412 Cuvier Street, San Diego, California 92037, commonly known as "La Jolla Marine," and identified as Assessor's Parcel Number 351-022-07 (Project); and

WHEREAS, the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) (Public Resources Code sections 21000-21177), section 21084, states that the CEQA Guidelines thereto (title 14, sections 15000 to 15387 of the California Code of Regulations) shall list those classes of projects which have been determined not to have a significant effect on the environment and which shall be exempt from CEQA; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to that authority, CEQA Guidelines sections 15300-15333 list the categorical exemptions promulgated by the California Office of Planning and Research and adopted by the Secretary of the California Natural Resources Agency for those classes of Projects which have been determined not to have a significant effect on the environment; and

WHEREAS, the Planning Department has established that the Project is categorically exempt from CEQA pursuant to CEQA Guidelines section 15312 and that no exception to the exemption, as set forth in CEQA Guidelines section 15300.2, applies to the Project; and

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of San Diego (City Council) has considered the potential environmental effects of the Project, and

WHEREAS, the City Council held a duly noticed public meeting and considered the written record for the Project as well as public comment; and

WHEREAS, the City Council, using its independent judgment, has determined that the Project will not have a significant effect on the environment because it is the sale of surplus government property which is not in an area of statewide, regional or area wide concern identified in CEQA Guidelines section 15206(b)(4); NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Council of the City of San Diego determines that the Project is categorically exempt from CEQA pursuant to CEQA Guidelines section 15312.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Council of the City of San Diego has determined that an exception to the exemption as set forth in CEQA Guidelines section 15300.2 does not apply.
