A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO AUTHORIZING ACCEPTANCE OF A GRANT FROM PROPOSITION 47 FUNDS VIA THE COUNTY OF SAN DIEGO, OFFICIAL GRANTEE AND THE LEAD AGENCY, AND TO FUND A PORTION OF THE PROGRAM MANAGER AND RELATED TRAVEL EXPENSES.

WHEREAS, in November, 2014, Proposition 47 was passed by over 60% of California voters; and

WHEREAS, Proposition 47 reduced certain criminal offenses from felonies to misdemeanors and shifted prosecution responsibility from the District Attorney's Office to the City Attorney's Office; and

WHEREAS, under Proposition 47, the State of California awards grant funds to counties within its borders to fund programs that support the criminal justice system in addressing the reasons for chronic misdemeanor offenders to continually cycle through the system; and

WHEREAS, in November, 2016, the Board of State and Community Corrections (BSCC) issued a Request for Proposal (RFP) for award of Proposition 47 funds; and

WHEREAS, the City of San Diego partnered with the County of San Diego to submit a proposal in response to BSCC's RFP and was awarded a \$6 million grant; and

WHEREAS, \$3 million of the grant is to be used for the San Diego Misdemeanants

At-Risk Track (S.M.A.R.T.) program, a collaborative program with the San Diego City

Attorney's Office, the San Diego Police Department (SDPD), the San Diego County Sheriff's

Department, and Family Health Centers of San Diego; and

WHEREAS, the Proposition 47 grant funding will support the primary goal of the S.M.A.R.T. program which is to reduce recidivism of chronic misdemeanor offenders. Further, each S.M.A.R.T. participant is assigned a case manager and offered individualized treatment and community based supportive housing; and

WHEREAS, financing of the S.M.A.R.T. program flows through the lead agency under the Proposition 47 grant, the County of San Diego; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Memorandum of Understanding/Agreement (MOU/MOA) with the County of San Diego, \$3 million of the grant funds awarded are set aside for S.M.A.R.T. a portion of which will be used to pay for half of the Program Manager's salary and related travel expenses. In addition, the County of San Diego will use a portion of the \$3 million grant to fund research by the San Diego Association of Governments (SANDAG) on the S.M.A.R.T. program, ; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Council of the City of San Diego accepts and authorizes the Chief Financial Officer to appropriate and expend \$185,550.00, plus related travel expenses, to fund half of the Program Manager's salary and related travel expenses through FY20.
