RESOLUTION NUMBER R- 311781

A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO AUTHORIZING YEAR-END REVISIONS TO THE FISCAL YEAR 2018 BUDGET OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO.

WHEREAS, on June 9, 2017, the Mayor approved Resolution No. R-311158, approving the City's Fiscal Year 2018 Budget (2018 Budget); and

WHEREAS, on June 26, 2017, the City Council adopted Ordinance No. O-20837, entitled "An Ordinance Adopting the Annual Budget for Fiscal Year 2018 and Appropriating the Necessary Money to Operate the City of San Diego for Fiscal Year 2018." (Appropriation Ordinance); and

WHEREAS, on February 14, 2018, the Mayor approved Resolution No. R-311538, approving the Mid-Year Revisions to the 2018 Budget; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor has now proposed to revise the 2018 Budget as presented in the Fiscal Year 2018 Year-End Budget Monitoring Report (Year-End Report) and the Year-End Report was presented to the City Council, sitting as the Budget Review Committee, on May 17, 2018; and

WHEREAS, Section 16 of the Appropriation Ordinance authorizes the Chief Financial

Officer to modify appropriations upon adopted City Council resolution, provided funding is

available for such action and in accordance with funding source guidelines and applicable grant

agreements; and

WHEREAS, San Diego Charter section 73 permits the City Council, upon the written recommendation of the Mayor, to transfer all or part of an unencumbered balance of an

appropriation to a purpose or object for which the appropriation for the current year has proved insufficient; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing to consider the proposed budget revisions has been held in accordance with San Diego Charter sections 69; and

WHEREAS, the City Council desires to approve the proposed appropriation changes as described below and in accordance with the Year-End Report; NOW, THEREFORE;

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of the City of San Diego that the Chief Financial Officer is authorized to revise the Fiscal Year 2018 Budget, as detailed in the Year-End Report, as follows:

- 1. Adjust General Fund (100000) revenue and expenditure appropriations as follows:
 - a. Increase expenditure appropriations by up to \$400,000 in the Office of the City Attorney (1211) for over budget expenditures associated to pay-in-lieu, supplemental positions, and termination pay;
 - b. Decrease expenditure appropriations by up to \$13,744,000 in the
 Citywide Program Expenditures Department (9912) for savings in
 non-personnel expenditures associated to a reduction in the transfer to
 various funds, and decreased expenditures associated to a special
 election, debt service payments, and rent;
 - Increase expenditure appropriations by up to \$325,000 in the
 Economic Development Department (1316) for over budget
 expenditures associated with the Safe Parking Program and consulting services;

- d. Increase expenditure appropriations by up to \$420,000 in the

 Environmental Services Department (2115) for over budget
 expenditures in contracts associated with the Hepatitis A and ongoing
 sanitation efforts;
- e. Increase expenditure appropriations by up to \$11,600,000 in the Fire-Rescue Department (1912) for over budget expenditures in contractual services for air operations support and fringe benefits associated to overtime, and increase revenue appropriations by up to \$5,100,000 to offset the increase in expenditures;
- f. Increase revenue appropriations by up to \$1,861,000 in the Major

 General Fund Revenues Department (9911) due to increases in

 franchise fee, sales tax, and other revenues;
- g. Increase expenditure appropriations by up to \$240,000 in the Office of Homeland Security (1915) for over budget salary and fringe benefit expenditures;
- h. Increase expenditure appropriations by up to \$4,040,000 in the Parks and Recreation Department (1714) for over budget expenditures in water to address stressed turf conditions and contractual expenditures associated with Hepatitis A efforts and the Bridge Shelters;
- Increase expenditure appropriations by up to \$335,000 in the
 Performance and Analytics Department (1312) to support expenditures
 associated with the Get It Done application, and increase revenue

- j. appropriations by up to \$335,000 to offset the increase in expenditures;
- k. Increase expenditure appropriations by up to \$300,000 in the Personnel

 Department (1212) for over budget expenditures primarily in salaries
 and vacation pay-in-lieu;
- Increase expenditure appropriations by up to \$820,000 in the Police
 Department (1914) for over budget expenditures in overtime for
 Hepatitis A related efforts, San Diego Riverbed Cleanup, and Bridge
 Shelters;
- Increase expenditure appropriations by up to \$40,000 in the Public
 Works—General Services Department (2113) for over budget
 expenditures associated with Hepatitis A efforts and the Bridge
 Shelters;
- n. Increase expenditure appropriations by up to \$1,120,000 in the Real

 Estate Assets Department (1613) for over budget expenditures in

 contracts associated with the Executive Complex relocation; and
- o. Increase expenditure appropriations by up to \$1,400,000 in the

 Transportation and Storm Water Department (2116) for over budget expenditures for fleet vehicle and equipment rentals.
- 2. Increase the Information Technology Fund (200308) expenditure appropriations and revenue appropriations by up to \$480,000 and \$200,000, respectively.
- 3. Increase the Petco Park Fund (200208) expenditure appropriations by up to \$740,000.

4. Increase the Transient Occupancy Tax Fund (200205) expenditure

appropriations and revenue appropriations by up to \$1,140,000 and \$745,000,

respectively.

5. Increase the Wireless Communications Technology Fund (200611) expenditure

appropriations and revenue appropriations by up to \$380,000 and \$110,000,

respectively.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Chief Financial Officer is authorized to transfer

appropriations between General Fund (100000) departments as necessary where the net transfer

does not result in an increase to either department's current budget.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Chief Financial Officer is authorized to transfer

appropriations among General Fund (100000) departments as necessary at fiscal year close to

match actual activity.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Chief Financial Officer is authorized to adjust

appropriations for unforeseen events in order to close Fiscal Year 2018 with departments and

funds in balance.
