A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO IN SUPPORT OF S.1593 (HARRIS-PAUL), THE PRETRIAL INTEGRITY AND SAFETY ACT.

WHEREAS, on February 26, 2018, the City Council approved the 2018 State and Federal Legislative Platform (Platform) for the City of San Diego (City); and

WHEREAS, the Platform defines the City's policy guidelines and provides a means to protect and advance the City's interests on priority issues, legislative and regulatory matters on the federal and state level, and, to a degree, on legislative and regulatory matters at the regional and local levels; and

WHEREAS, the Platform includes priorities in support of public safety on both a state and federal level (Platform Focus 5); and

WHEREAS, recently introduced federal legislation, S.1593 (Harris-Paul), the Pretrial Integrity and Safety Act, would encourage states with money bail systems like California's current system to institute changes to their systems, through the use of grants and other federal tools; and

WHEREAS, according to data from the U.S. Bureau of Justice Statistics, 1 in 3 black men and 1 in 6 Hispanic men nationwide will be incarcerated in their lifetimes; and

WHEREAS, under article I, section 12 of the California Constitution, an individual arrested and charged with a crime must be granted release on bail, except in certain circumstances, for example, when facts are evident, or the presumption is great that the individual being held committed certain violent crimes, or the individual is a flight risk; and

WHEREAS, studies from Human Rights Watch, a non-profit and non-governmental organization, found that over 63 percent of people detained in California county jails have not been sentenced, but are serving time incarcerated, often due to their inability to post bail, which in California is \$50,000 for a felony or five times higher than the national median; and

WHEREAS, the current wealth-based bail system results in individuals who can safely be released from custody instead being held at government expense until their case is adjudicated and has significant and long-lasting impacts on the outcomes of people's cases, their economic security, well-being and health; and

WHEREAS, according to the California Budget and Policy Center, nationally, incarceration is a more-costly tool than supervised release with taxpayers paying over \$14 billion dollars a year to keep people in jail while they wait for their initial court hearing; and

WHEREAS, S.1593 (Harris-Paul), the Pretrial Integrity and Safety Act authorizes a \$10 million grant over a three-year period and sets forth principles governing those grants to incentivize and encourage states to replace the practice of money bail; and

WHEREAS, this bill further authorizes an additional \$5 million over three years to the Bureau of Justice Statistics to implement a National Pretrial Reporting Program, which provides for data collection on the processing of defendants; and

WHEREAS, this bill requires that an annual report to the Department of Justice be made that provides for transparency and accountability for these grant programs; and

WHEREAS, City residents are affected by California's money bail system and therefore experience the inequities and disparities that have brought about the federal legislation to encourage states to replace the money bail system; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds that S.1593 (Harris-Paul) would significantly assist

California's efforts to reform California's money bail system; and

WHEREAS, the Pretrial Justice Institute estimates that bail reform could result in

roughly \$78 billion in savings in a year and provide for a more effective, efficient, safer, and

equal criminal justice system; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City stands publicly in support of

S.1593 (Harris-Paul), the Pretrial Integrity and Safety Act, which would support California in

reforming or replacing its money bail system.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City Clerk is directed to send a copy of this

resolution to the President of the United States and the Honorable Members of the

115th Congress of the United States who represent the San Diego region, urging passage of

S.1593.
