A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO DETERMINING THAT THE APPROVAL OF AN AGREEMENT WITH SCS ENGINEERS, INC. TO PERFORM INTERIM OPERATIONS, MAINTENANCE, AND GAS SUPPLY SERVICES AT THE MIRAMAR LANDFILL IS CATEGORICALLY EXEMPT FROM THE CALIFORNIA ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY ACT PURSUANT TO CEQA GUIDELINES SECTION 15301(b).

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of San Diego (City Council) intends to let an agreement for interim Landfill Gas Collection System operation and maintenance for the Miramar Landfill (Project); and

WHEREAS, the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) (Public Resources Code section 21000 et seq.), section 21084, states that the CEQA Guidelines thereto (California Code of Regulations, Title 14, Chapter 3, Section 15000 et seq.) shall list those classes of projects which have been determined not to have a significant effect on the environment and which shall be exempt from CEQA; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to that authority, CEQA Guidelines sections 15300-15333 list the categorical exemptions promulgated by the California Office of Planning and Research and adopted by the Secretary of the California Natural Resources Agency for those classes of Projects which have been determined not to have a significant effect on the environment; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has considered the nature of the Project and its potential environmental effects; and

WHEREAS, on July 31, 2018, the City Council held a duly noticed public meeting and considered the written record for the Project as well as public comment; and

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of San Diego, using its independent judgment, has

determined that the Project will not have a significant effect on the environment because the

Project principally involves operations, repair, maintenance, permitting, leasing, licensing, or

minor alteration of the Landfill Gas Collection System; and

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Council of the City of San Diego determines that the Project

is categorically exempt from CEQA pursuant to CEQA Guidelines section 15301(b) which

consists of the operations, repair, maintenance, permitting, leasing, licensing, or minor alteration

of existing public or private structures, facilities, mechanical equipment, or topographical

features, involving negligible or no expansion of use beyond that existing at the time of the lead

agency's determination.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Council of the City of San Diego has

determined that an exception to the exemption as set forth in CEQA Guidelines section 15300.2

does not apply.
