A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF
SAN DIEGO RECEIVING AND ACCEPTING THE SOLID
WASTE DISTRICTED EXCLUSIVE COLLECTION SYSTEM
STUDY AND APPROVING RECOMMENDATIONS TO
INCORPORATE KEY STUDY FINDINGS.

WHEREAS, the City of San Diego (City) currently utilizes a non-exclusive solid waste collection franchise system to regulate collection, transportation, and disposal of refuse generated by commercial facilities, residences on private streets, and multi-family residences located on public streets which are not eligible for City-provided collection services; and

WHEREAS, in August 2014, the Office of the City Auditor (Auditor) completed an audit of the City's Environmental Services Department (ESD) Waste Reduction and Recycling Programs, and recommended that ESD examine the potential for transitioning from the current non-exclusive franchise system to a districted exclusive franchise system, wherein the City would be organized into several defined service districts with a single hauler awarded a franchise to perform solid waste collection activities in each district; and

WHEREAS, the City issued a Request for Proposals (RFP) and selected R3 Consulting Group, Inc. (Consultant) in March 2017 to perform an assessment of the City's current non-exclusive franchise system and to evaluate whether transitioning to a districted exclusive franchise system would be beneficial to the City; and

WHEREAS, in August 2018, the Consultant produced the Districted Exclusive Collection System Study (Study), which identified several advantages and disadvantages of implementing a districted exclusive franchise system; and

WHEREAS, ESD has evaluated the Study and the findings and recommendations therein, and recommends against transitioning to a districted exclusive franchise system for various reasons including, but not limited to, decreased competition, impacts on customer prices, and adverse effects on smaller waste hauling businesses; and

WHEREAS, in lieu of transitioning to a districted exclusive franchise system, ESD recommends incorporating several of the advantages of a districted exclusive franchise system identified by the Study into the City's existing solid waste hauling franchise agreements, including waste diversion requirement modifications, requirements for alternative fuel vehicles, performance measures and customer services metrics, and franchise agreement extension terms, and also recommends franchise fee increases; and


WHEREAS, ESD presented the findings of the Study and City staff's recommendations to the Environment Committee on September 13, 2018, where the unanimous vote was to receive the Study, approve staff's recommendations, and forward the Study to the full City Council for receipt of the Study and acceptance of ESD's recommendations; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the City Council of the City of San Diego, that the Districted Exclusive Collection System Study is received and accepted by the City Council.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City Council accepts ESD's recommendations to negotiate modifications to the existing solid waste collection franchise agreements to incorporate certain advantages identified in the Districted Exclusive Collection System Study .
