A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO DETERMINING THAT THE APPROVAL OF THE SINGLE USE PLASTIC REDUCTION ORDINANCE IS EXEMPT FROM THE CALIFORNIA ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY ACT PURSUANT TO CEQA GUIDELINES SECTIONS 15061(B)(3) (GENERAL RULE) AND 15308 (ACTIONS BY REGULATORY AGENCIES FOR PROTECTION OF THE ENVIRONMENT).

WHEREAS, the Single Use Plastic Reduction Ordinance prohibits the distribution of egg cartons, food service ware, and food trays which are made in whole or in part from polystyrene foam, prohibits the use of coolers, ice chests, pool or beach toys, or dock floats, mooring buoys, or navigation markers made with polystyrene foam, unless those items are encased in a non-polystyrene foam material and prohibits the use of these egg cartons, food service ware, food trays, coolers, ice chests, pool or beach toys, dock floats, mooring buoys, or navigation markers in City facilities (Project); and

WHEREAS, the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) (Public Resources Code section 21000 et seq.), section 21084, states that the CEQA Guidelines thereto (California Code of Regulations, Title 14, Chapter 3, Section 15000 et seq.) shall list those classes of projects which have been determined not to have a significant effect on the environment and which shall be exempt from CEQA; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to that authority, CEQA Guidelines section 15061(b)(3) states that a project is exempt from CEQA if the activity is covered by the general rule that CEQA applies only to projects which have the potential for causing a significant effect on the environment.

Where it can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the activity in question may have a significant effect on the environment, the activity is not subject to CEQA; and

WHEREAS, CEQA Guidelines sections 15300-15333 list the categorical exemptions promulgated by the California Office of Planning and Research and adopted by the Secretary of the California Natural Resources Agency for those classes of projects which have been determined not to have a significant effect on the environment; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to that authority, CEQA Guidelines section 15308 states that actions taken by regulatory agencies, as authorized by state or local ordinance, to assure the maintenance, restoration, enhancement, or protection of the environment where the regulatory process involves procedures for protection of the environment are exempt from CEQA; and

WHEREAS, the Planning Department staff has established that the Project is exempt from CEQA pursuant to CEQA Guidelines sections 15061(b)(3) and 15308 and that no exception to the exemptions, as set forth in CEQA Guidelines section 15300.2, applies to the Project; and

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of San Diego has considered the potential environmental effects of the Project, and

WHEREAS, on October 15, 2018, the City Council held a duly noticed public meeting and considered the written record for the Project as well as public comment; and

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of San Diego, using its independent judgment, has determined that the Project will not have a significant effect on the environment; and

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Council of the City of San Diego determines that the Project is exempt from CEQA pursuant to CEQA Guidelines sections 15061(b)(3) and 15308.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Council of the City of San Diego has determined that an exception to the exemptions as set forth in CEQA Guidelines section 15300.2 does not apply.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City Clerk is directed to file a Notice of Exemption regarding the Project with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors for the County of San Diego.
