A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO DENYING THE APPEAL AND APPROVING AN ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION THAT THE PROPOSED MARIJUANA PRODUCTION FACILITY TO BE LOCATED AT 9350 TRADE PLACE IS EXEMPT FROM CALIFORNIA ENVIRONMTAL QUALITY ACT (CEQA) PURSUANT TO GUIDELINES SECTION 15301 – PROJECT NO. 585463.

WHEREAS, an application was submitted for a Conditional Use Permit (CUP) to operate a Marijuana Production Facility (MPF) within an existing 40,536 square-foot, two-story building located on a 2.3-acre site at 9350 Trade Place, Suites A, B, C, and D, Project No. 585463 (Project), in the Mira Mesa Community Plan area; and

WHEREAS, on September 26, 2018, the Environmental Analysis Section (EAS) of the Development Services Department (DSD determined the subject project to be categorically exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to CEQA State Guidelines Section 15301 (Existing Facilities) and determined that the exceptions to the exemption do not apply; and

WHEREAS, a Notice to Right to Appeal was prepared and posted pursuant to San Diego Municipal Code Section 112.0310; and

WHEREAS, on October 10, 2018, an environmental determination appeal was filed by Elizabeth Kizzier; and

WHEREAS, the appeal was heard by the City Council on December 3, 2018; and WHEREAS, under San Diego Charter section 280(a)(2), this resolution is not subject to veto by the Mayor because this matter requires the City Council to act as a quasi-judicial body and where a public hearing was required by law implicating due process rights of individuals

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affected by the decision and where the City Council was required by law to consider evidence at

the hearing and to make legal findings based on the evidence presented; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the City Council of the City of San Diego, that the appeal of the

Environmental Determination is denied, based upon the substantial evidence provided in the

records to support the categorical exemption and the determination that no substantial evidence

has been provided to support a fair argument that one of the exceptions to the categorical

exemption applies.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that Environmental Exemption No. 585463 for the

Project is approved and the Project is exempt from CEQA, pursuant to Guidelines Section

15301.
