DATE OF FINAL PASSAGE MAY 31 2019

A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO SUPPORTING CALIFORNIA STATE ASSEMBLY BILL 392: CALIFORNIA ACT TO SAVE LIVES.

WHEREAS, on March 11, 2019, City Council approved the 2019 State and Federal Legislative Platform (Platform) for the City of San Diego (City); and

WHEREAS, the Platform defines the City's policy guidelines and provides a means to protect and advance the City's interests on priority issues, legislative and regulatory matters on the federal and state level, and, to a degree, on legislative and regulatory matters at the regional and local levels; and

WHEREAS, the Platform includes priorities in support of public safety on both a state and federal level (Platform Focus 5); and

WHEREAS, the Platform supports state legislation that will strengthen community and law enforcement relationships and fund programs designed to enhance transparency and foster positive interactions with law enforcement, helping to raise the trust and confidence of the communities they serve while addressing crime effectively; and

WHEREAS, according to the California Department of Justice, in 2017, the last full year for which statistics are available, use of force by California police officers lead to the deaths of 172 people, half of whom did not have a gun (https://openjustice.doj.ca.gov/2017/use-of-force); and

WHEREAS, of the unarmed people that lost their lives due to use of force by California police officers, three out of four were people of color (https://openjustice.doj.ca.gov/2017/use-offorce); and

WHEREAS, under the current California Penal Code section 196, police officers can use deadly force regardless of whether it is necessary to prevent death or serious bodily injury; and

WHEREAS, California's law governing when a homicide by an officer is "justified" fails to include policing best practices recommended by law enforcement organizations, including the United States Department of Justice under President Obama and, most recently, by the California Department of Justice, as being effective in preserving life while also allowing police officers the latitude they need to ensure public safety. and

WHEREAS, California State Assembly Bill 392 (California Act to Save Lives) authored by Assembly Members Shirley Weber and Kevin McCarty redefines the circumstances under which a homicide by a police officer is deemed justifiable to include when it is done in self-defense or in defense of another, consistent with the existing legal standard for self-defense, or when it is necessary to prevent the escape of a fleeing felon whose immediate apprehension is necessary to prevent death or serious injury; and

WHEREAS, AB 392 would bar the use of the self-defense justification if the police officer acted in a criminally negligent manner that caused the death, including if the police officer's criminally negligent actions created the necessity for the use of deadly force; and

WHEREAS, AB 392 would ensure California law is consistent with policing best practices to avoid unnecessary police shootings and ensure community safety by providing a clear definition for when officers are permitted to use deadly force; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, that the City of San Diego urges the California Legislature to pass and Governor Newsom to sign into law the California State Assembly Bill 392.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City Clerk shall send a copy of the approved Resolution to the following: Governor Gavin Newsom, Office of the Governor of the State of California and the California State Legislature.
